## DePaul Prep beats Deerfield 45-25, advances to Super-Sectional

DePaul Prep is rolling, after another dominant playoff win for the Rams. This time a 45-25 win over Deerfield in the 3A Antioch Sectional Final Friday. The DePaul Prep Rams' success (30-4) is going way past impressive and moving into historic.

This is DePaul Prep's fifth Sectional championship in the last six seasons with playoffs. The four previous sectional wins ended with two third place finishes and two championships.

The Deerfield Warriors came into the game 24-7 fresh off an upset victory over Lake Forest, the number 2 seed in the sectional. They finished second behind 4A Sectional champ Evanston in the Central Suburban South Conference. They brought height and shooters.

But the Rams are rolling. In the

first couple possessions, it was evident that the ultra-quick ball movement of the Rams to their shooters in the corners was not going to be as open usual. Deerfield was too quick in getting into the faces of the Rams' shooters.

Okay. Plan B—go inside to Lashaun Porter.

The Warriors had no answer for that. Rams' junior center Lashaun Porter opened the game with three dunks and eight of the Rams 14 first quarter points. The Rams completely controlled the first quarter only giving up four points. Deerfield's outside shots were not falling and the Rams quickly shutdown attempts to drive the lane.

The second quarter was not quite so dominant. Deerfield reeled off a 10-0 run late in the second quarter to make it a five-

## Armed men rob another Wrigleyville bar-goer

Another bar-goer was mugged March 9 in Wrigleyville, a part of town where police say organized crews have been targeting late-night revelers at closing time.

The victim was on the corner of Clark and Cornelia when two armed men demanded his valuables around 1:30 a.m., according to preliminary information. The robbers fled on foot after getting the man's phone, cash, and cards.

Officers were told to be on the lookout for two Black males, one with dreadlocks, wearing dark clothing. They were both 6'-1" or 6'-2" tall with medium builds.

CPD has issued two warnings this year about robbery crews targeting Wrigleyville and Gold Coast bar-goers as they wait for rideshares at closing time. Three of the five Wrigleyville robberies occurred in the 3500 block of N. Clark, the same block where Sunday's robbery was reported. It is unclear if the latest victim was targeted by the group CPD has been warning about.

The known crime pattern usually involves three or four robbers who approach victims and either

display a gun or use force to get control of their valuables. The robbers have even accessed some of the victims' bank accounts through phones taken during the hold-ups, police said.

In Wrigleyville, the robberies occurred in the 3500 block of N. Clark at 1:30 a.m. and 2:30 a.m. Jan. 5; in the 3500 block of N. Clark at 1:10 a.m. on Jan. 11; the 1000 block of W. Newport at 2 a.m. on Feb. 9; the 3500 block of N. Clark at 1:55 a.m. on Feb. 23, and on the the 3600 block of N. Clark at 3:45 a.m. on Feb. 23.

Gold Coast robberies were reported at 3 a.m. on January 11 in the first block of W. Division and the next day at 2:16 a.m. in the first block of E. Elm. CPD describes the suspects as three or four Black males between 16 and 25 years old

While the Wrigleyville robbers have been problematic, robbery reports across the rest of the Lakeview-based Town Hall 19th District are down 38% this year, with 43 cases reported as of March 2. That number is still well above the levels seen in 2023 and 2022, however.

## Privileged bike paths to spread further on Clark St., Montrose to Winnemac the next victim

Under the rubric of pedestrian and cyclist safety, the city has announced plans to expand privileged bike paths on Clark St. from Montrose north to Winnemac.

Privileged bike paths are portions of the public way that are cordoned off behind concrete barriers and reserved for the exclusive use of one privileged class of transportation, in this case bikes.

Concrete barriers include curb bump outs, lane blockers, islands and street narrowing which have become frequent tools used by Chicago city planners to intentionally create traffic congestion and slow travel times, as a part of the World Economic Forum's 15-Minute City concept.

Under the 15-Minute City concept, the aim is to systemically segregate communities by creating man-made barriers to travel, hoping residents can access most of their daily needs, like work, shopping, healthcare, and leisure, within a 15-minute walk or bike ride from their home. Planners think this concept minimizes vehicle usage while promoting a more walkable, sustainable, and community-oriented urban envi-

ronment.

To make matters worse for drivers, the city is also removing metered commercial street parking at a heightened pace in favor in privileged bike paths and bus-only lanes. Metered street parking that turns over quickly is a critical need for commercial districts to survive.

When metered street parking is removed, that means potential customers must find parking elsewhere. And if they can't find parking, many times they go elsewhere and will avoid the area in future shopping trips.

As residents of urban areas know, not all neighborhoods offer

equal and equitable options. In large swaths of the city commercial deserts exist. So by intentionally making it difficult to access other communities, city planners limit commercial choices and service options to consumers from historically disadvantaged neighborhoods. Traveling outside one person's 15-minute neighborhood is made more difficult through the systemic segregation augmented by taxpayer-funded man-made barriers.

In 2023, the Dept. of Planning and Development completed the Clark Street Crossroads plan that removed parking from Clark St. and narrowed the roadway from Irving Park north to Montrose.

Prior to that, the Chicago Dept. of Transportation [CDOT] butchered the Clark St. commercial corridor in Edgewater between Rosehill and Devon Ave. by removing commercial street parking in favor of narrowed and blocked roadway for privileged bike lanes that have since resulted in massive traffic problems.

The next victim of the bike and

## What's coming to Under-L areas

**Parking, salting, snow/trash removal and more explained**

While the CTA recently hosted two public meetings to share conceptual renderings of what the new community areas under the CTA's Red and Purple Lines may look like, we heard that design plans include a pedestrian trail, dog parks, playground, fitness areas, benches and a flexible-use plaza are being included.

We asked Andrew Gavrilos, CTA senior communications representative, what the day-to-day services community users of the new areas might encounter that are known at this early time. Gavrilos must be commended for his openness and willingness to answer questions; a vast and re-

freshing difference from some other city agencies.

The new Under-L public area is in the final design stages for the 10-block space under the new "L" tracks between Lawrence and Ardmore, as part of the \$2.1 billion Red and Purple Modernization [RPM] Phase One Project. The newly opened area runs between two alleys to the immediate east and west of the CTA tracks. Construction of these spaces is expected to begin in 2026 and be completed in 2027.

Gavrilos said the new area is CTA property and will remain CTA property with no plans to relinquish it to the Chicago Park District. The Under-L activation will offer managed parking opportunities for visitors, residents and businesses on the west side at the south end that could be rented for customers or for parking plat-

forms like SpotHero. Similar to metered parking, the CTA intends for these parking spaces to be turned over throughout the day.

The Chicago Police Dept. [CPD] will be responsible for site security of the Under-L area. There will be no police emergency signal boxes. "The CTA [and] the CPD regard public safety as our highest priority. We understand the concerns of our customers, employees and local residents related to safety and security on and around the CTA rail and bus system. We will continue to work closely with the CPD in coordination with the local aldermanic offices to keep the areas safe for the community.

Regarding concerns over homeless campers portions of the area, they have "recently expanded our

# It's important to hold on to recollections and memories

The nearness of St. Patrick's Feast is a natural catalyst for memory and nostalgia. We fall back on the past thousands of cozy family celebrations and a lot of recurring over-the-top social festivities all meant to mark the grandeur of this day.

At this moment I long for those cozy family occasions so filled with harmony and tasty vittles. All those wintry March gatherings in which my grandmother ran her kitchen like a steel mill with ovens cranking out sublime meals of savory Irish character.

The St. Patrick's Day air in that kitchen will always be remembered best in the aroma of a leg of lamb roasting on aromatic vegetables with perfumed scents from roasting fresh rosemary as pungent and poignant still as a Christmas tree.

We thrived on the creamed onions that always made an appearance. And special for that day, a buttery batch of "Colcannon." An Irish version of mashed potatoes with savory cabbage, chopped and crunchy, added to the Irish butter and heavy cream that really was a hold over to Grandma's growing up at Reagoulawn, the Crowe Family's Tipperary dairy farm. Of course the sauce from pan drippings were the perfect accompaniment for the lamb meat and spuds. Often roasted carrots were plentiful and charred just right.

But later in life you'd often find me at the Irish Fellowship Dinner at the Conrad Hilton where a thousand fancy Irish dined and kicked up their heels.

Local Irish notables, politicians, judges, clergy, visiting Irish

diplomats and Chicago celebrities circled the Grand Ballroom surrounded by an army of bagpipers.

The occasion was always made more grand with a wondrous collection of the Bridgeport Daleys, especially during the decades of those celebrated mayoral administrations. Both father and son Daley mayors served as presidents of the Irish Fellowship over the decades. Beginning with the great man, himself, Richard J. Daley. He really helped to expand the membership and the scope of the club, first founded in 1901 with Mayor Edward Fitzsimmons Dunne as the first president. The only person to later serve as Governor of Illinois as well.

Back in 1956, Mayor Daley brought young Massachusetts Sen. John Fitzgerald Kennedy to the club's black tie dinner with hopes of getting him on the Democratic ticket as vice president at the upcoming convention. Kennedy met all the necessary power folk and wowed them. When he was not selected at the convention, Mayor Daley set his goal for larger plans and was instrumental in getting JFK elected to the office of president in 1960.

But for me, while celebrating St. Patrick with 1,000 friends is festive, it doesn't hold a candle to the family coming together around that leg of lamb, or a big juicy prime rib.

There was always an abundance of fresh homemade Irish soda bread. And buttery apple tarts for dessert. That was as predictable as the Irish music my aunt would play on her hi-fi stereo, as big as a piano. A most important piece of electronic furniture back in the 1950s.

My father would always have his squeezebox nearby and add a live music performance sing-singing Irish tunes. Of course grandchildren were expected to do their favorite jigs and reels through the sitting rooms and parlors of the house. The dances, like the grandchildren, came in all shapes and sizes.

Grandma O'Gorman would always join in, as light on her feet

as a young girl.

It was truly an O'Gorman festival down to the Irish linen and the polished silver, thanks to the added work of grandchildren days in advance. They were expected to help in preparation for a day as big as Christmas.

It's important to hold on to such recollections and memories in which the grandeur and pageantry of the past is able to add meaning, purpose, clarity and cultural identity through to the present. It is as the Irish poet, W.B. Yeats, wrote, "How many loved your moments of glad grace."

These moments add light to our present. Is that "glad grace" not the glory of a life well lived? Knowing that our parents and grandparents had embraced such moments of glad grace truly redeems the times we live in now.

I take comfort in the hope that

such memories can give us today the courage to sustain America's freedom and liberty. In our crumbling Chicago of tragic urban incompetent government, it provides the hope to create a better future after all.

That's what I see in celebrating St. Patrick's Day. Not a moment of mindless Irish bragging, soaked in green beer and shamrocks. But the authentic cultural understanding of who we Irish really are. And what is necessary for us to do. That's what the Colcannon taught us, and the creamed onions heralded for human hope. The strength of our family. People of ancient faith and custom. People filled with "great moments of glad grace."



# Aldermen decry VA outreach program shutdown

## VA cuts hit ordinary Chicago veterans across city

The U.S. Dept. of Veteran Affairs [VA] will cut tens of thousands of jobs and shut down an important outreach program that serves armed forces veterans in several Chicago wards.

Ald. Matt Martin [47th], told WGN News that he received a notice from the VA office March 5 saying that the VA outreach program will not be able to serve veterans in his ward and surrounding wards that utilize his Lincoln Ave. ward office for meetings. The program is geared toward connecting veterans to healthcare, housing needs, employment, disability pay and other veteran benefits.

"To ensure we provide the highest level of care where needed most, we must temporarily pause our comprehensive outreach program," a letter sent to the aldermen said.

"We understand this is short notice and sincerely wish there was more time to prepare for this transition. However, after careful evaluation, it became clear that immediate action was necessary to ensure that our Veterans receive the highest level of care in the areas where they need it most. This decision was not made lightly," the letter read.

On March 5, the VA announced plans to cut about 80,000 jobs across the agency as part of a Trump administration restructuring to begin in August.

This would require firing thousands of employees hired after the VA expanded under the Biden administration. More than one quarter of VA staff positions are veterans themselves.

The VA requested a budget of \$369.3 billion for fiscal year 2025. This is a 9.8% in-

crease from the 2024 budget. This includes \$134 billion in discretionary funding. Additionally, there is \$235.3 billion in mandatory funding, an increase of \$41.8 billion or 21.6%, above 2024 for benefit programs, inclusive of Compensation and Pensions, Readjustment Benefits, Housing and Insurance, and continued funding for the Toxic Exposures Fund.

"There's nothing wasteful or inefficient about how the VA has been endeavoring to serve members of the armed forces who have given so much to our country," Martin said.

"I get completely the desire to make government work better and more efficiently at all levels, including at the city level. But we don't need to take a bus to our critical programs. That's exactly what has [been] done here. We are going to have thousands of people across Chicago who are hurt because of it," said Martin.

On March 5, Ald. Matt O'Shea [19th] said he saw five veterans in line waiting for one-on-one support from the VA. "Veterans served their country," O'Shea said. "And they didn't turn their back on us. They were there, protecting the freedom we all enjoy. Now, the government is turning their back on veterans."

"It really pisses me off, because the fact is you have Republicans and Trump talking about patriotism, America First," Ald. Gilbert Villegas [36th] said. "It goes contrary to the message you're trying to deliver. Are you America First and patriots, or are you just a fraud listening to a billionaire trying to make cuts."

Villegas is a Marine Corps veteran who helped spread the outreach program that he said took place across more than a dozen ward offices.

In a released statement, the mayor's office said that "we should be adding an additional 80,000 positions to the VA, not cutting them. [We are] steadfast in our belief that our veterans deserve the best we have to offer."

As of right now, there is no word yet from the Jesse Brown VA Medical Center, 800 S. Polk St., on how many employees and veterans in Chicago would be impacted by the cuts in the outreach program.

The Federal Trade Commission estimated that in 2023 alone, the VA reported \$477 million in losses due to fraud. Scammers continue to take advantage of new opportunities to commit fraud, and fraud attempts targeting veterans, their families, caregivers, and survivors are on the rise. Scammers often target veterans because they have access to benefits and resources.

## Mayor adding 50 new speed cameras to city streets

### By ticketing drivers, Johnson hopes to balance budget

Chicago will add 50 new speed cameras to city streets as part of Mayor Brandon Johnson's plan to try and balance the 2025 budget. The new cameras increase the city's stock by 30% to 212 cameras in total.

The city's Dept. of Transportation [CDOT] confirmed in late February that it is "actively working" to install the 50 cameras but declined to share the locations saying they have yet to be finalized.

Multiple aldermen told the Chicago Tribune that CDOT officials called them recently to float addresses in their wards for a new speed camera, all of which were at intersections where residents had raised concerns when it came to speeding and crashes, though the city never provided the media evidence of those residents' concerns.

The cameras are controversial. While some believe they are a useful traffic enforcement aide and revenue enhancing tool, others note the supposed 'historical' racial disparities in ticketing although automated enforcement would appear to be race-neutral.

Others say the burden the tickets place on speeding working-class drivers make the cameras a regressive method of raising money. The mayor and CDOT counts among their progressive base of supporters many residents who prioritize cycling and scooting, while promoting ways to tax wealthier people by using technology to issue tickets.

While Chicago has aggressively pursued automated ticket-writing, down the road in Ohio, a decade ago the Ohio House of Representatives passed bipartisan legislation that likely sounds utopian to Chicago drivers, they prohibited municipalities, counties, townships and the state highway patrol from using red-light cameras and speed cameras to assist in the enforcement of traffic laws.

Each new camera will have an initial 30-day grace period, during which speeding drivers will be left off with a warning notice in the mail. After that, those caught going 6-to-10 mph too fast will get \$35 tickets, while those going 11 mph or over will receive a \$100 ticket, as is the standard citywide.

Chicago's automated ticketing systems, including speed cameras, red-light cameras, and parking meters, generated over

\$102 million in fines in 2023. The city's budget for 2024 relies on \$348 million in fines and fees from these sources.

Johnson isn't the first mayor to realize a financial windfall from ticketing Chicago drivers. Mayor Rahm Emanuel turned on speed cameras in 2013 and they brought in more money than expected. That began the

trend of using the devices to raise funds.

Mayor Lori Lightfoot lowered the ticket threshold in 2021 from 10 mph over the speed limit to 6 mph to help close a \$1.2 billion budget deficit.

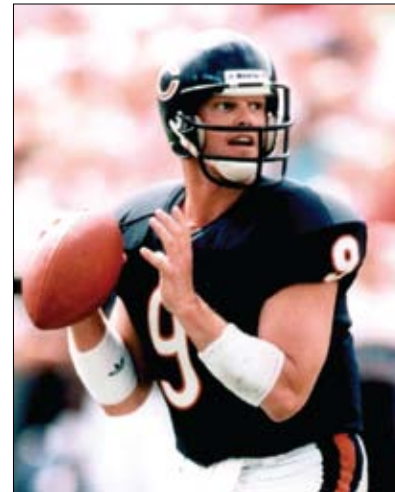
The city operates but does not own the cameras. They are leased from vendor Verra Mobility, formerly American Traffic Solutions. The devices utilize a 3D radar to capture video and license plates.

Only cameras in designated "Safety Zones," or 660 feet from a park or school are considered, per state law.

## Lecture on early history of the Green Mill, March 27

The early history of the famous Green Mill Lounge will be presented 6:30 p.m. Thursday, March 27, by the Ravenswood Lake View Historical Assoc. in the Lerner Auditorium, Conrad Sulzer Regional Library at 4455 N. Lincoln Ave.

Author Robert Loerzel has been delving deep into the early years of the Green Mill — and related things, like the development of the Uptown neighborhood — in a history posted in chapters on his website, robertloerzel.com. Loerzel has also reported on this topic for WBEZ's Curious City show.

The Green Mill, 4802 N. Broadway, began its life in 1907 as Pop Morse's Gardens, alternatively known as Pop Morse's Roadhouse. It originally was meant to serve locals visiting St. Boniface's Cemetery at Clark and Lawrence. In 1910, Tom Chamales bought the establishment from Pop Morse, who added outdoor dancing and entertainment in an enlarged sunken garden. He installed the "Rhumba Room" on

the second floor, and constructed a large green windmill on the roof to go along with its new name, the "Green Mill Gardens."

The Green Mill is best known for serving as a gangster hangout and speakeasy during Prohibition. During this time, it was leased by the Chamales Brothers to the mob, including James Vincenzo (Gebardi) DeMora — better known as Jack "Machine Gun" McGurn — who held a stake in the club.

Now over 100 years old, the Green Mill Cocktail Lounge is the crown jewel of the local jazz scene and Uptown neighborhood.

Guests will find out some of the secrets he has uncovered on the beginnings of this beloved Uptown jazz club.

Loerzel, a freelance journalist, wrote the book *Alchemy of Bones: Chicago's Luetgert Murder Case of 1897* and co-wrote two episodes of WTTW's Chicago Stories series ("The Union Stockyards" and "The Race to Reverse the River").

Bally's initial \$250 million public offering for women and minority investors failed to close as planned in early February after it stalled at the Securities and Exchange Commission [SEC].

Bally's Chairman Soo Kim, said: "We're going to update our financials and resubmit, but we don't know why the SEC didn't respond the first time, and they may not respond the second time."

Meanwhile, unlucky Bally's also has been plagued with construction mishaps while razing the former Chicago Tribune printing plant on 30 acres at 777 W. Chicago Ave.

Demolition was delayed for nearly a month after a Dec. 14 accident spilled tons of construction debris into the adjacent Chicago River. Earlier, a deep-tunnel water pipe was "discovered" under the site of the 500-room high-rise hotel planned at Chicago Ave. and Halsted St.

Following a finalized site redesign—which moved the 34-story hotel tower from north of the casino to the south—Bally's began driving foundation caissons into the ground last month.

In addition to the casino's 3,400 slot machines and 173 gaming tables, Bally's plan also includes, an entertainment complex, a food hall, four bars, an outdoor park and an amenity terrace. The casino is targeted to open in Sept. 2026, according to Bally's.

Bally's temporary Medinah Temple facility posted adjusted gross receipts of only \$9.2 million in January, a slight year-over-year decline, according to Gaming Board Data.

Overall, Rivers Casino Des Plaines topped the list of Illinois casinos with \$39 million in ad-

justed gross receipts in January. The new Wind Creek Chicago Southland casino in East Hazel Crest raked in \$13.3 million in January, capturing second place in revenue among the state's 16 casinos.

"Bally's temporary casino at Medina Temple is not pulling the numbers that were expected," Mr. Zak, a veteran professional gambling consultant, told The Home Front column.

Despite opening the Medina Temple location 24/7, picking up the private parking tab for tens of thousands of gamers, and bussing hundreds of Chinese and Asian gamblers to the temporary casino, the revenue stream there over the past few months has pumped only a few million dollars into the City of Chicago tax coffers.

That's \$10 million short of what former Mayor Lori Lightfoot's administration projected and earmarked to fund the city's police and firefighter pensions.

Financial experts say casino revenue theoretically is a great source to use for city pensions because it exports the tax burden. Hopefully at least a portion of the tax revenue generated from Bally's casino operations would come from individuals who do not live in the city. However, if casino revenues fall short, the city may need to increase real estate taxes or find alternative sources of revenue.

In 2022, Bally's predicted the casino would inject \$200 million annually into city pension coffers. However, Bally's is not contractually required by the city to actually deliver that amount.

Earlier, Ald. Brian Hopkins [2nd] also has expressed doubts about the expected Sept. 2026

opening date for the permanent Bally's casino. "The target date for construction of the new permanent casino seems optimistic at best," he said.

"If Bally's meets its funding and construction deadlines and actually opens in Sept. 2026, imagine what a nightmare the congested corner of Chicago Ave. and Halsted St. will be," said Mr. Zak.

"Bally's bought the deal with a \$40-million upfront bribe to the Lightfoot administration," observed Mr. Zak. "The Chicago-and-Halsted site is the most horrendous place they could put it. I would have preferred that the Chicago casino be built by Rush Street Gaming at 'The 78', the 62-acre vacant mega site on the Chicago River at Roosevelt Rd."

However, Bally's casino and hotel is targeted for the bustling intersection of Chicago and Halsted. It is boxed in by the Chicago River, vehicular bridges and Metra railroad tracks—not an ideal site for a mega casino development.

Traffic congestion on Chicago west of Halsted also includes a steady flow of trucks from a cement plant on Goose Island.

City bus boosters and bike enthusiasts also are up in arms about the Chicago Dept. of Transportation's plans for widening Chicago Ave. at Halsted St. near the proposed casino site. The CTA's No. 66 Chicago route is one of the city's busiest bus lines.

In 2024, the Plan Commission also recently approved the multi-phase "Halsted Landing" development at 700 W. Chicago Ave. just east of Halsted St. Later phases are proposed further west on Goose Island.

Plans of the developer, Onni Group, call for four high-rises and two mid-rises with 2,451 residential units, including 490 affordable units. One of the high-rises will rise to 600 feet and contain 688 residential units, including 138 affordable units.

The Halsted Landing plan also calls for 280 hotel rooms, more than 55,000 square feet of commercial space and 1,950 parking spaces.

In comparison, the development will be almost as large as Sandburg Village—one of the nation's biggest urban renewal projects.

Let's roll the dice and look into the future. When 4,000 new, mostly low-income housing units are completed at the reborn Cabrini-Green project, Bally's likely will run free shuttle buses down Chicago Ave. to the casino, and the boulevard will resemble the Las Vegas Strip.

# Property Tax Exemptions: How homeowners and seniors can save on taxes

Property taxes can be a financial burden, but exemptions can help reduce those costs by offering significant savings to property owners. There are three exemptions that do the most good for the most people.

They are the Homeowner Exemption, the Senior Citizen Homestead Exemption and the Senior Freeze Exemption. The Cook County Treasurer's Office is dedicated to helping

residents apply for these exemptions to lower their property tax bills.

First, check the exemptions you're receiving by visiting [cookcountytreasurer.com](http://cookcountytreasurer.com) and clicking on the purple box labeled Your Property Tax Overview. Search using your address or 14-digit Property Index Number.

If you use your address, simply enter your house number and street name. Do not include north,

south, east or west. A picture of your property – home, business or land should appear, so you know you've found the right place. Scroll down and you should also see a grid with your exemptions.

If the word "No" appears, as seen in this example grid, you could be leaving significant money on the table.

To turn some of those "Nos" into yeses, let's look at our major exemptions.

### Homeowner Exemption:

This is the granddaddy of exemptions, with most property owners qualifying. This lowers property taxes for homeowners who occupy their home as their primary residence for at least a year. First-time applicants must have lived in the property as of Jan. 1 of the tax year in question. The exemption renews automatically each year unless the property is sold. Check your status online and apply for any missed

In Cook County there is a Homeowner Exemption, the Senior Citizen Homestead Exemption and the Senior Freeze Exemption.

Homeowner exemptions from the past four years.

### Senior Citizen Exemption:

Homeowners applying for Senior Citizen Homestead Exemptions for the first time are eligible if they're 65 or older and own and occupy their property as their principal place of residence. If a married couple jointly owns a home, they're eligible when the older partner is 65. To receive this exemption, the applicant must have owned and occupied the property as of January 1 and must have been 65 years of age or older during the tax year in question. That means many homeowners who turned 65 in 2023 are now

eligible for this tax break for the first time. They should apply now so the Senior Citizen Homestead Exemption savings can be reflected on their 2024 Second Installment bills due later this year.

### Senior Freeze Exemption:

Applicants must meet age and income requirements to qualify for the Senior Freeze Exemption. Seniors aged 65 and older with an annual household income of \$65,000 or less are eligible. You must have owned and occupied the home on Jan. 1 of the tax year in question. This exemption "freezes" the equalized assessed valuation [EAV] of the property the year that the senior citizen

qualifies for the benefit, insulating the senior from soaring property taxes that come with rising EAVs. Unlike other exemptions, you must re-apply for the Senior Freeze every year since income levels can change.

### How to apply for exemptions and refunds:

Apply for these exemptions online at [cookcountytreasurer.com](http://cookcountytreasurer.com) where you can search for yourself or anyone else. Verify that you're receiving the exemptions you're entitled to and apply for any you've missed. Remember, you can apply for any missed exemptions going back four years.

## Illinois residents stick with the current state flag

Nearly 385,000 votes cast statewide in flag design contest

Illinois voters overwhelmingly prefer the current state flag over twelve other competing flag designs, according to Alexi Giannoulas, Illinois Secretary of State. The current state flag received more than 165,000 votes, or about 43%, out of nearly 365,000 votes cast.

The current flag, colloquially known as an SOB – a seal on a bedsheet – features the Seal of the State of Illinois on a plain white background with the word, "ILLINOIS," printed under the seal.

"The results are, let's just say, overwhelming," Giannoulas said in an Instagram video announcing the news on March 6. Earlier this year, voters were given an option to vote over a five-week voting period.

The contest comes after a bill sponsored by State Sen. Doris Turner and signed by Gov. J.B. Pritzker in 2023 created a state-wide commission to explore the creation of a new flag. While the people have voted, the commission will now send a report detailing its findings to the Illinois General Assembly who will ultimately be responsible for deciding on whether to keep the current flag or jettison it.

Like many other states, the current Illinois state flag was the result of a contest sponsored by the Daughters of the American Revolution [DAR].

During a 1911 visit to Washington, D.C., Ella Park Lawrence, then State Regent of DAR, noticed that no flag of Illinois was on display in the Continental Memorial Hall.

Eager to create a flag, she offered a \$25 prize to the Illinois DAR chapter submitting the best

design for the flag. In those days, \$25 was extraordinarily generous, equivalent to about \$600 today. The winner, Lucy Derwent, of the Rockford chapter, submitted the winning design.

The flag remained the same until 1968 when U.S. Navy Chief Petty Officer Bruce McDaniel of Waverly, then serving in South Vietnam, noted that unlike other state flags displayed in the mess

# Police Beat...

## Man charged with stabbing on CTA train

David Davis, 31, of the 1600 block of S. Singer Dr. in Freeport, IL, was arrested and charged March 7 with felony counts for aggravated battery/use deadly weapon; aggravated battery/transit employee; attempted robbery while armed with a dangerous weapon on the CTA.

Davis was identified as the offender who stabbed and injured a 31-year-old male at 1:25 a.m., in the 100 block of N. State St. while riding a train. Responding officers quickly located the offender and he was placed into custody and subsequently charged accordingly.

## Witnesses uncooperative after gunman kills victim on River North sidewalk

Witnesses were uncooperative after a man was shot and killed during an argument on a River North sidewalk March 9. The gunman remains at large.

Chicago cops were less than a block away when the shooting occurred in the 500 block of N. Franklin at 3:15 a.m. They immediately called out shots fired and quickly found the 31-year-old victim. He had suffered seven gunshot wounds, according to an officer at the scene.

In a media statement, CPD said the victim and another man had an argument that turned physical before the offender pulled out a gun and fired several shots, striking the victim in the chest.

The gunman escaped on foot, police said, but CPD did not release a suspect description.

Officers stopped four men about two blocks from the shooting scene, but witnesses refused to cooperate with the investigation by verifying if any of the men were involved in the shooting, police said. One of the four men was arrested for a warrant. Police released the other three after collecting their identifying information.

The victim is the third person shot in River North this year and the second to die from their injuries. Both of the previous victims were shot during a single incident at a hotel in the 300 block of W. Grand on Feb. 22. Charges have been filed in that case.

## Man shot by 'known offender' inside Roscoe Village home

Police are looking for a known suspect after a man was shot inside his Roscoe Village home March 8.

The 53-year-old victim was at home in the 1900 block of W. Roscoe when the man shot him around 8:18 a.m., according to Chicago police.

A 911 caller reported that the shooter was her ex-boyfriend and that he came to the house and shot her roommate in the shoulder, according to police radio traffic. The suspect, who has two felony gun convictions in Cook County, fled the scene on foot.

Officers at the scene said he is Middle Eastern, 35 years old, 5'-8"

tall and 145 lbs. He may have been wearing khaki pants and a jacket with two colors.

Saturday's shooting is the first in Roscoe Village since Dec. 2021.

## Lakeview migrant awaits extradition, accused of killing 2, injuring 3 while driving high in rural Iowa

A Venezuelan migrant who has been living at a Lakeview shelter is now in custody, awaiting extradition to Iowa, where he is charged with killing two people in a car crash while driving with THC in his system. Renzo Jose Sira Parra, 27, and two other people were also injured in the Dec. 11, 2024 collision, which occurred at a rural intersection in the northwest corner of the state.

Iowa authorities said Sira ran a stop sign as he headed north and collided with a local woman's car as she headed east, about three miles west of Sioux Center.

Two men riding the back seat of Sira's Honda Fit were ejected from the vehicle, officials said: Maikol Segobia, 28, and Alfredo Lira, 24. Both men, who listed Chicago addresses, died at the scene. A third man in Sira's vehicle was taken to Sioux Falls for advanced medical treatment. None of them were wearing seatbelts.

Sira, the 28-year-old woman, and a 43-year-old man in her car were all wearing seatbelts, according to police. They were injured, but survived the crash, which totaled both vehicles.

After the crash, officials said Sira showed signs of impairment and smelled of marijuana. Toxicology tests allegedly revealed the presence of THC and its metabolites in his system. He admitted to smoking marijuana after waking up on the morning of the crash and before driving, according to Iowa court filings.

Sira returned to the shelter at 640 W. Irving Park shortly after the crash, according to a Chicago police report. When Chicago police went to the shelter recently to arrest Sira on behalf of the Iowa State Patrol, an employee denied knowing his whereabouts, the report said.

Ultimately, Town Hall 19th District tactical officers worked with Sira's wife to bring him into the district station near Wrigley Field.

He is being held on an Iowa warrant for two counts of homicide by vehicle while under the influence, according to a Cook County court filing.

Sira's only other arrest in Chicago came last fall when employees at the Uptown Target store accused him of shoplifting about \$30 worth of baby clothing. Prosecutors dropped the charges on his first court date.

## He attacked a 74-year-old with wire cutters at Fullerton CTA station

Prosecutors have charged a man with using wire cutters to viciously attack a 74-year-old man on a Red Line CTA train in Lincoln Park.

Maurice Rocquemore, 38, pulled out the wire cutters and began striking the senior in the face and body at the Fullerton station around 10:45 p.m. Feb. 17, officials said. Rocquemore escaped after the attack, which prosecutors said was completely random.

The victim received staples and

stitches to close injuries on his head. Chicago police officers arrested Rocquemore when he appeared for a court hearing last week on an unrelated trespassing charge. He was wearing the same clothing as on the day of the attack and had the same wire cutters, Judge Shauna Boliker wrote in a detention order.

In his arrest report, officers said Rocquemore was also suspected of another attack at the Fullerton station on the day before the 74-year-old was targeted.

Bolker ordered Rocquemore to remain in jail pending trial on two counts of aggravated battery with a deadly weapon.

## Man who help robbed victim during Grindr meet-ups gets 7 years

One of the men accused of robbing a victim at gunpoint after arranging to meet him for a bit of fun via Grindr, the gay dating app, has been given a seven-year prison sentence. Andre Mhoon, 30, and Antoine Perteet, 35, went to the victim's home in the 1900 block of W. Morse on June 28, 2023.

In court filings, prosecutors said Perteet met the man on a dating app, and the victim agreed to let Perteet and Mhoon come to his home. They arrived at the victim's house around 11:30 p.m. and, once inside, pulled out guns. They robbed the man, forced him to lie down in the bedroom, and took his cash and phone, prosecutors alleged.

The complaint said Perteet forced the man to unlock the device and then accessed his digital wallet. While Mhoon held the victim at gunpoint, Perteet allegedly went to an ATM and tried to make a withdrawal with the phone.

Prosecutors said Perteet and Mhoon collected the man's jewelry and credit cards, then left.

The next day, Chase notified the victim that someone tried to use his debit card at one of their branches in Rogers Park. The victim also learned that one of his cards was used at a gas station on the Far North Side and a liquor store in Waukegan.

Perteet, who was a teacher at a Christian school in Waukegan at the time of the allegations, continues to fight the charge as well as a second, similar robbery.

On March 4, Mhoon pleaded guilty to aggravated robbery before Judge Maria Kuriakos-Ciesel, according to court records. She handed him seven years, which will be reduced by 50% with good behavior. The remaining time will be reduced by another 590 days of credit Mhoon earned since being arrested.

Prosecutors claimed last year that Chicago police evidence technicians found Mhoon's fingerprint at the scene of a "similar" armed robbery, which allowed investigators to link him to the Rogers Park case. He was never charged with any other robberies, though.

## River North robber was wearing an electronic monitoring bracelet — for another attempted robbery

A man on probation for trying to rob a woman on the CTA Red Line is now accused of trying to rob a man in River North—while wearing an electronic monitoring bracelet. Robert Snell, 35, has been detained to await trial by Judge Anthony Calabrese.

Chicago police responded to the 400 block of N. State around 8:45 p.m. Feb. 24 after a Michigan man called 911 to report the robbery attempt, officials said. The victim reported that a

man approached him, indicated that he had a weapon, and demanded money, Snell's arrest report said.

Armed with a description of the would-be robber, cops detained Snell in a nearby alley and then arrested him after the victim confirmed they had the right guy. In Snell's arrest report, officers noted that he was wearing an ankle monitor on his left leg.

According to court records, Snell is on probation for trying to rob a woman on the Red Line at Loyola in Dec. 2023. In that case, he allegedly confronted the victim and warned, "You have 10 seconds to give me your bag or else. I know you have lots of money." He proceeded to grab her bag and try to pull it away, a CPD report said. The robbery failed when bystanders intervened and called police.

He pleaded guilty on November 18 in exchange for a two-year probation sentence from Judge Sharon Kanter.

## Case against protestors blocking O'Hare entry

A group of pro-Hamas and anti-Israel activists hope to toss a class action lawsuit seeking to make them pay for blockading the main road into O'Hare International Airport for three hours last spring, allegedly "imprisoning" innocent bystander "hostages" in the resulting traffic snarl and upending countless travel plans and other life and work events in the process, to stage what plaintiffs called an illegal protest in support of a terrorist Islamic regime.

In their filings, the activists say the lawsuit amounts to a frivolous lawsuit attempting to silence their speech and allegedly falsely label them as supporters of terrorism.

The legal action first landed in Chicago federal court in Sept. 2024, when attorney Theodore "Ted" Frank, M. Frank Bednarz, Neville S. Hedley and others with the Hamilton Lincoln Law Institute filed suit against the activist organizations.

The lawsuit seeks to expand the action to include potentially thousands of others who were caught in the hours-long traffic jam caused when members of the activist organizations blocked Interstate 1-90 ramp into O'Hare Airport last April.

The blockade was intended by the activists to not only disrupt traffic leading into the airport, but to maximize economic and societal disruption in an effort to protest the Israeli military actions against Hamas in Gaza in response to the Oct. 7, 2023 terrorist attacks Hamas launched in Israel.

The complaint asserts the Chicago blockade was part of a nationwide coordinated effort, known as A15, "to disrupt major economic centers" in the U.S. in an effort to support efforts by Hamas to rally international support in the U.S. and elsewhere to pressure Israel to halt their military operations in Gaza.

The blockade lasted for three hours and resulted in thousands of people missing flights, leaving people scrambling and missing important events at their intended destinations. The complaint is seeking unspecified compensatory and punitive damages, plus attorney fees.

The plaintiffs are also seeking a court order forbidding the activists from attempting such an action again. Organizations named as defendants in the action include the National Students for Justice in Palestine; WESPAC Foundation; Dissenters; Jewish Voice for Peace; and The Tides Center, which does business as the Community Justice Exchange.

Individual defendants are identified as activists Jinan Chehade, identified as a primary organizer of the O'Hare blockade; Superior Murphy, who filmed the blockade; Rifqa Falaneh,

identified as present of the SJP's DePaul University affiliate in Chicago and an organizer of the blockade; and Simone Tucker, identified as a JVP organizer and organizer of the blockade.

In response, the activists and their organizations have urged the court to dismiss the lawsuit. They have also moved for sanctions against the plaintiffs.

The case is being heard by U.S. District Judge Mary M. Rowland.

## Clerk convicted of sexually assaulting teen in downtown convenience store disappears before sentencing

A convenience store clerk convicted in January of sexually assaulting a 15-year-old runaway boy in the Loop has disappeared after the judge refused a prosecution request to keep him in jail to await sentencing.

A jury needed less than 90 minutes to find Bharath Simha, 22, guilty of criminal sexual assault during the commission of a felony and two counts of kidnapping in connection with the December 2023 attack at 7-Eleven, 4 E. Jackson.

But Judge Peggy Chiampas denied the state's request to revoke Simha's electronic monitoring status and have him jailed so he didn't flee to escape prison time, according to court records.

Those records show Simha failed to appear for his next court date on Feb. 14 and yet another date on February 21. During the second hearing, Chiampas decided to sentence Simha in absentia, saying he "willfully absconded."

She gave him 10 years for the sexual assault, of which he must serve 85%, and seven years for the kidnapping charges. The judge also issued a nationwide arrest warrant for Simha, who is now facing a new charge of escaping electronic monitoring.

Shortly after Simha was arrested in Dec. 2023, prosecutors said a 15-year-old boy who ran away from home after arguing with his mother stopped into the convenience store, only to be sexually assaulted by the cashier.

Upset with his mother, the boy left home on Dec. 7, 2023, and walked for three or four hours before going to the store around 9 p.m., officials said. After Simha buzzed the boy in, the teen asked Simha if he could do some work, such as cleaning, in exchange for food because he had no money.

Simha agreed and gave him a cookie and directed the boy to the store's single-stall bathroom, according to a transcript of Simha's initial detention hearing. The boy entered the restroom, thinking Simha wanted him to clean it in exchange for food.

Instead, Simha allegedly grabbed the boy's shoulders and forced him to his knees inside the bathroom. Simha exposed himself and forced his private part into the boy's mouth for "a few seconds," the transcript said. The teen cried as it happened, and Simha allegedly placed \$6 in the boy's hand.

Prosecutors said the boy fought Simha off and tried to run out of the store, but Simha chased him and blocked his path. Simha struggled with the boy and told him not to tell anyone, but the boy managed to escape.

Once he was out of the store, the boy ran until he saw a Chicago police car and then reported the attack to the officers.

# Lakeview YMCA killer receives 888 year sentence

## Second suspect killed by Ohio Highway Patrol

For Chicago area residents complaining about Cook County judges being soft on crime, they better hope they don't meet Judge James Obbish in the courtrooms of the Leighton Criminal Courthouse at 26th St. and California Ave.

Judge Obbish sentenced George A. Field, 64, to 888 years in prison on Feb. 28 for the Jan. 2, 2018 murder of his neighbor, Arthur Cannon, then 83, in the residential housing area of the Lakeview YMCA, 3333 N. Marshfield Ave., in Lakeview, according to a CWBChicago report by Tim Hecke.

Field was convicted in a bench trial for killing Cannon in Cannon's fourth floor residence as the octogenarian begged for his life, Assistant Cook County State's Attorney Julia Ramirez testified during the initial bond hearing.

Building security found Field holding a hand truck that he used to batter Cannon about the head before gouging Cannon's eyes out of his skull. The security officer called for Chicago Police who arrived and found Field on top of Cannon. Cannon died at Advocate Illinois Masonic Medical Center 10 days later. Cannon suffered broken ribs and multiple facial fractures from Field's attack.

Cannon was able to tell officers that he and Field engaged in a heated argument before Field

struck Cannon multiple times with a closed fist. His condition gradually deteriorated before Cannon finally succumbed to his injuries.

Field was previously sentenced to the custody of the Illinois Dept. of Corrections [IDOC] in 1985 following a murder conviction. Before being released on parole in 2006, Field was convicted of aggravated battery of a corrections officer while in prison.

Field's court-appointed attorney said at the time that Field suffered from "various mental conditions" and took "many medications."

In the most recent murder trial, Field was found guilty of seven counts of murder and one count of home invasion by Judge Obbish on Jan. 29.

On Feb. 28, Obbish handed down the sentence of 888 years for murder and eight years for home invasion to be served concurrently.

Field was transferred to IDOC custody on Feb. 4 and is currently at the Northern Reception Center [NRC] of Stateville Correctional Center, Crest Hill, IL. The NRC functions as the major adult male intake and processing unit for the entire state. It is a maximum security unit.

The NRC contains 1,800 beds in 24-units. Five percent of the

population are convicted of murder. The population demographics by race are 64% black, 21% white, 14% Hispanic, and 1% Asian. Field will eventually be transferred to a permanent institution.

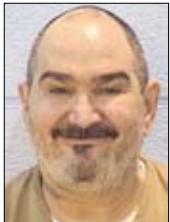
In another violent death on the fourth floor of the Lakeview YMCA on Sept. 2, 2023, police discovered YMCA tenant Michael L. "Jake" Lyerla, 27, unresponsive on the floor with a handgun nearby in a unit belonging to another tenant, Danny E. Berry, 45.

Lyerla had suffered a gunshot wound to his head and succumbed the following day at Advocate Illinois Masonic Medical Center. Berry had absconded from the building.

Chicago Police, tracking Berry's cellphone, notified Ohio State Highway Patrol that Berry was wanted for a homicide in Chicago and was traveling southbound on Interstate 75.

Following a high-speed pursuit through three counties, Berry's Chrysler Pacifica van was forcibly stopped after stop sticks were deployed and police forced the vehicle to crash. Berry was fatally shot after he alighted from his burning van and began walking down the Interstate toward people while armed and vowing 'not to go back to jail and he was going to kill himself.'

Berry had been previously employed as a security guard at suburban hotels but was recently hired as a doorman at a high-rise along Chicago's lakefront.

Simha initially denied that he assaulted the boy, but then changed his story to say the boy tried to rob the store, prosecutors claimed. He allegedly told the police that the store didn't have security video, but investigators found the video and showed him images from the footage.

Officials said Simha changed his story several times during interviews with detectives. After initially claiming nothing sexual happened, he allegedly said something sexual did happen, but it was the boy's idea. That story evolved again and again, prosecutors stated.

As Simha's trial was about to begin, his attorney agreed to a prosecution stipulation that the defense could not mention Simha's immigration status during the trial or raise the possibility that he could be deported, according to court filings.

But when Simha heard that, he "strongly disagreed" and asked his attorney to reverse his position, the filing said.

"The very essence of the Defendant's defense is that he was afraid that he would be deported as a result

of his involvement of any kind with the police since he was working while on a student visa (and not on a work visa)," his attorney wrote in a follow-up motion. The lawyer also said Simha believed that his fear of deportation would explain his behavior during police interviews.

Simha's attorney during the first court hearing said he grew up in India and earned an engineering degree there.

## Man charged with North Side train robbery after cop recognizes him in 'wanted' poster

One of two men wanted for robbing a Red Line passenger on the North Side in November has been arrested after a Chicago cop recognized him in a "seeking to identify bulletin."

The robbery occurred around 12:24 a.m. Nov. 1 on the Sheridan Red Line platform, 3940 N. Sheridan, police said. Two men approached the victim, claimed they had a gun, and stated something to the effect of, "Don't move. Give me everything you got, I have a pistol," according to prosecutors.

The 37-year-old victim handed over his backpack, phone, and other items

to the men, who escaped on a north-bound train, officials said.

Nearly a month later, investigators released four CTA surveillance images of the suspects and asked the public to help identify them. As it turned out, the break came from another CPD officer who recognized one of the men as Abdulkarim Hussein, 29, of Des Plaines, according to prosecutors.

The police arrested Hussein when he recently appeared at the Skokie courthouse for a pending retail theft case. He also has two misdemeanor retail theft cases pending, court records show.

Judge Antara Rivera revoked his pretrial release in those cases and ordered him detained on a charge of aggravated robbery.

There have been news stories throughout the decades of renters who fall so far from society's rules that they forfeit their privilege of living in any given building. In earlier times, such people might be banished from that society. Today, their 'housing of last resort' might be space in a jail, prison, or mental hospital. Ability to pay isn't the only criterion.

I'm sure Don DeBat knows all this too.

# Blessing sought abroad; Chicago is home for Lakeview writer

**Author and her mother were big fans of *The Song of Bernadette***

Chicago native Carla Knorowski knows how to bring France's famous cities home.

Having received in 2022 the French government's Order of Merit for raising \$500,000 toward rebuilding Paris' fire-torn Notre Dame Cathedral, she now shares the story of Lourdes and the role of a beloved keepsake.

In her new book, *Blessing My Mother's Rosary*, Knorowski tells the tender story of her mother's life, sorrow at her death, and how – decades apart – two visits to the Catholic shrine of St. Bernadette led her through heartache to healing.

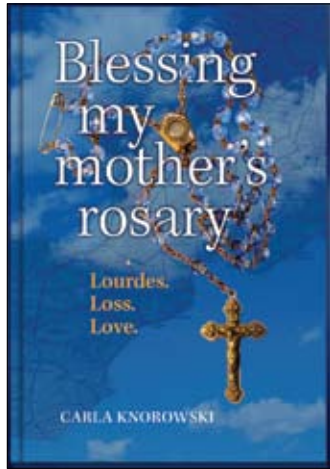
The biography is at once deeply personal yet accessible to all experiencing grief.

"I was very close to my mother," Knorowski explained. "One of the things that happened, when cleaning out her personal effects, was that I came across my mother's favorite rosary.... The rosary was part of her, one [item] that was quintessentially Mom."

Knorowski recalls that her mother had asked to have the circular strand of indigo blue beads blessed at Lourdes during her initial trip when she was a young backpacker in the 1980's. Now in her 60's and coming across the beloved, worn keepsake – with a safety pin replacing a bead – Knorowski knew there was yet unfinished business.

The story tells of the initial Lourdes journey and an epilogue that brings resolution and peace.

"Finally, as odd and even absurd as it seems, I realized that grief, like my mother, is a precious gift that propels me to honor her in all I do. Her death was not the end

of our relationship; rather, it was the beginning of a richer, more complete one," Knorowski writes.

For more than 20 years, Knorowski has lived in Lakeview, seven blocks from Wrigley Field. Growing up in Cragin, attending St. Genevieve parish and school, she had a typical 1960's childhood. She, along with her best friend, Mary Jo Wenmouth, rode bicycles to Wrigley and researched sports stars' biographies at the Chicago Public Library.

She was also a big fan of *The Song of Bernadette*, the 1943 film based on the novel of the same name by Franz Werfel, a Jewish intellectual who had found refuge from the Nazis in Lourdes. The movie starred actress Jennifer Jones and loosely details the story of Bernadette Soubirous, the young girl who sees the Virgin Mary in the Lourdes grotto as a spring spontaneously opens. Bernadette was canonized as a saint in 1933, and the film had a great influence on Knorowski's devout mother.

"Jennifer Jones was the spitting image of my mother," Knorowski said as she

explained that she and her Mom watched the film whenever they could. Watching it together, Knorowski understood how if further fed her mother's love and admiration for the Virgin Mary, St. Bernadette, and Lourdes.

"Carla and I were close to her Mom," said Wenmouth. "Always her parting words were, 'God love you.' We say the same to each other because we knew each other so well."

"Carla was always up for anything...always up for a challenge," she added. "Her love of France doesn't surprise me. She goes where she feels called," said Wenmouth.

Bill Bike, a former colleague from the

Univ. of Illinois at Chicago, where Knorowski earned her Bachelor's, Master's, and Ph.D. degrees and worked in alumni relations, describes Knorowski as "very Chicago."

"She came from a typical Chicago background and accomplished so much," Bike explained. "She's easy to work with, down to earth, no pretension," he added.

For more than 35 years, Knorowski has been a leader in the non-profit sector. She currently serves as Senior Advancement Advisor for The Henry Ford Museum of American Innovation. She has also held leadership positions at the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library Foundation and the Naval War College Foundation. She co-authored *Under Lincoln's Hat: 100 Objects that Tell the Story of His Life and Legacy* and *Gettysburg Replies: The World Responds to Abraham Lincoln's Gettysburg Address*.

Knorowski also contributes her talents to various Chicago organizations including the Chicago Humanities Festival, Northwestern Illinois Univ. and its Foundation, and the Illinois Alumni Assoc. She also serves on the board of directors of the University Club of Chicago, Dehkoda Educational Foundation, and Friends of Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris.

A current writing project focuses on fun travels to cities, towns, and villages around the world named "Paris."

"There are 28 [Chicago] Sister Cities in the world," Knorowski said. "Paris [France] beats them all. The reason I love Paris so much is because it reminds me so much of Chicago. I'm so proud of our skyline, our city. When I was in Paris, I could see similarities. Everywhere you look, you see beauty. I see the same in Chicago.... I can't imagine living anywhere else."

## The Chicago I want to live in

I appreciate my neighbors who have engaged in discussions about the Broadway upzoning process. Even when I disagree with certain viewpoints, public debate is fundamental to our democracy. I look forward to working with those I disagree with to build a diverse, resilient, and inclusive Edgewater and Uptown.

A small vocal group has held outsized influence in the 48th Ward for decades and is now struggling to adjust to a new reality. Chicago is changing, and city leadership is working to ensure all voices are heard, not just the loudest ones. The Broadway Land Use Framework is not about a handful of individuals—it's about shaping the future of Edgewater and Uptown in a way that benefits the ward, the city, and future generations.

Opponents claim this process was rushed and lacked transparency. That could not be further from the truth. Over the past several months, the Dept. of Planning

and Development [DPD] hosted three community meetings—two in person and one via Zoom—to ensure accessibility. The DPD website provides recordings, notes, and presentations. A public feedback form was available for months, and 1,500 people filled it out, with the majority supporting the plan. The Chicago Plan Commission [CPC] received over 450 letters, 300 in support. All written feedback is publicly available.

Ald. Leni Manaa-Hoppenworth and her staff have gone above and beyond to engage the community, meeting with block clubs, listening to concerns, and fielding calls and emails. Every week, she has shared updates on the project and ways to engage.

Yet, somehow, this is not enough. At the CPC's in-person hearing, where 40 people spoke, a select few vocal opponents resorted to disruptive behavior, rudely interrupting city officials. Their strategy was not about civil discourse but about shouting down

progress.

This plan reflects a democratic process in action, incorporating input from over 1,500 engaged residents, the majority of whom want a more vibrant, welcoming Broadway that supports housing, businesses, and future generations. Cities across the country are adopting processes like those used by the DPD because, historically, planning decisions were often influenced by a small but vocal minority resistant to any change. Chicago is moving toward a more equitable, transparent process where all voices are

considered, not just those with historical influence.

The city has done the right thing by weighing all voices—not just the loudest, most entrenched ones. The question now is whether we move forward as a city that values inclusivity, growth, and opportunity or allow the same voices that have long resisted progress to hold us back.

I know what kind of Chicago I want to live in.

partnership with the city and social service agencies, which conduct outreach” to the homeless and “provide options and access to service,” Gavrilos wrote.

Asked about periodic maintenance, trash/snow removal and salting, Gavrilos replied, “The CTA is exploring working with an outside property management firm for the basic upkeep of the area under the ‘L’, as well as possibly working with local stakeholder groups on agreements for use and upkeep of certain areas. There will not be trash or recycling bins. We encourage people to carry out their trash and use public receptacles on city streets or at CTA stations.”

It has yet to be determined if local Special Service Areas will

perform a role in this area.

When asked about tent encampments and after-school gatherings by adolescents, Gavrilos said the areas are patrolled by the CPD and the CTA is working with local aldermanic offices and city social service providers to best service people in need and to keep people in the community safe.

There are no public restrooms included in the Under-L area nor are there plans to include signs prohibiting firearms in the Under-L area. The CTA is furnishing a pedestrian trail, not a bicycle pathway, Gavrilos clarified. There will be Chicago Dept. of Transportation [CDOT] approved crosswalks at all intersections with side streets from Lawrence to Bryn Mawr. All crosswalks will follow CDOT standards and will not be raised.

point game at the half.

When asked about public artwork on the support posts under the overhead “L” tracks, Gavrilos explained, “CTA must be able to inspect and maintain all structures. Covering any of the structures in any way including with public art will not allow proper inspection and maintenance so therefore is not an option. Graffiti is against the law. Public art is not part of the concept but could be something that is funded and added by [the community] at a later time.”

When asked about hours of operation or possible closing time, Gavrilos stated, “It has yet to be determined if hours of operation will be posted. Under ‘L’ are public spaces and subject to the same law that applies to other public spaces. There are no specific hours for this area.”

Also on Friday, DePaul Prep junior guard Rykan Woo was named to the Chicago Sun-Times “All Area” team, which recognizes the top players in the Chicago metropolitan area.
