Landmark Immaculata campus development stalled, says alderman

A proposed development which would have replaced the parking lot of the historic campus of the former Immaculata High School, 640 W. Irving Park Rd., with a 23-story high-rise apartment building for seniors seems to have stalled.

Unveiled at a public meeting in January, the proposal by Chicago-based CA Ventures included a total of 495 units. If approved, the project would have converted the landmarked Immaculata High School building into 275 residential units and a high-rise tower that includes 220 units for senior citizens. The project also includes 140 parking spaces.

Speaking virtually to the members of Buena Park Neighbors neighborhood organization on the evening of July 13, Ald. James Cappleman [46th] said he has not heard anything from the devel-



oper since their January presentation. “I know many of your members what to know what is happening. We have no clue. The last time the developers were in touch with us was the January meeting. We have not heard from them since,” Cappleman said.

While development has stalled on prominent high-rise projects in Chicago and across the nation due

to disruptions caused by COVID-19, Cappleman says it is actually not an unusual circumstance.

“Well, about 90 to 95% of those who come to us with projects for developments, they come to us once or twice and then leave. Given COVID-19 [and] the ongoing financial crisis, it may not happen,” Cappleman added.

Five indicted in West Ridge federal drug investigation

Five individuals have been indicted on drug charges as part of a federal investigation into cocaine trafficking on the North Side.

During the multi-year investigation, law enforcement seized more than 365 grams of suspected crack or powder cocaine, and six grams of fentanyl.

Much of the alleged drug trafficking occurred in the West Ridge neighborhood.

An indictment returned in U.S. District Court July 9 charges five defendants with conspiracy and other federal drug offenses: Joshua Moore, also known as “Big Moe” and “Big Guy,” 41; John Heard, also known as “Bird,” 30; Earnest Greene, also known as “Ernie,” 20; Jose Fontanez, also known as “Joey Crack,” 38; and Antonio Maxey, also known as “Tone,” 32.

Greene currently remains at large, while the other defendants are either in law enforcement custody or have been released on court-supervised bond.

According to the indictment and a criminal complaint previously filed in the case, Moore operated a drug trafficking organization near the intersection of Devon and Western avenues. Moore’s operation also utilized a drug stash house in the 7000 block of N. Rockwell St., directly across the street from Indian Boundary Park, the charges allege.

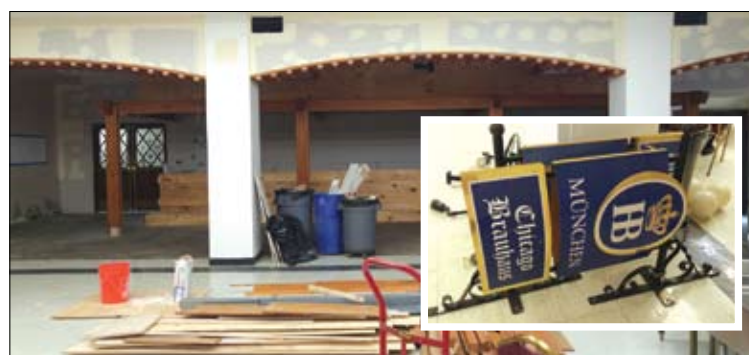
As part of his operation, Moore purchased wholesale quantities of cocaine and packaged it for distribution on the street, the charges state. He also allegedly “cooked” the powder cocaine into crack cocaine for street sale. Moore either sold narcotics directly to customers or supplied the drugs to his co-defendants to handle the sales, the charges state.

During the investigation, law enforcement made numerous undercover purchases of crack cocaine or powder cocaine from Moore’s organization, according to the charges.

story building at 4740 N. Western Ave.

City brings contact tracing jobs to North Side

Since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, millions of Americans have lost their jobs. After many months, the virus is finally creating new jobs with the help of federal funding given to both the City of Chicago, and the State of Illinois. The new jobs being created are for contact tracers. Chicago has allocated \$56 million to this program, hiring 600 new tracers. The state is hiring another 4000. This job requires only basic communications skills, and a willingness to help people.

The contract tracers will be pseudo-investigators. Their goal

is to help find the contact point where people initially have contracted the virus, in hopes of containing it. They will be speaking with those who have been infected, to find a point of origin.

Since the beginning of the pandemic, high density central urban areas like Chicago’s Loop, Near North and North sides have been at the forefront of trying to contain the spread of the virus. This new initiative hopes to do that, as well as reduce unemployment in areas of greater economic hardship. Eighty-five percent of the funding is federally mandated to be dispersed into areas negatively affected, around the city. The con-

tract tracer job is paying \$20 per hour with supervisors starting at \$24 an hour. Once hired, there is a short training period. The work will last 18 months.

The position is also supported by an “Earn and Learn” program, which will help the tracers pursue

Chicago legends would tell us, time to stop hiding what's really unfolding in Chicago

Do you have a favorite Chicago legend, you know, someone who epitomizes the very spirit and ethos of Chicago?

Yes that could be a long list, everyone from the White Sox's Bill Veeck to the redoubtable Jack Brickhouse at the radio microphone for both the Cubs and the Sox.

Maybe your tastes run to the classical with a memory of Sir Georg Solti at the symphony or Sir Andrew Davis at the Lyric Opera.

Perhaps you consider TV newsmen like Walter Jacobson and Bill Curtis the prototype of the genre. Not to mention the saintly Cardinal Bernardin at Holy Name Cathedral or restaurateur Gordon Sinclair quietly at his signature Clark St. address reinventing Chicago dining in the 1980s. Or Maestro Stanley Paul keeping the Chicago beat going at the famed Pump Room.

Don't forget the revolutionary architects like Louis Sullivan, Daniel Burnham and Mies van der Rohe who put us on the map. Some might be nostalgic for master puppeteer Burr Tilstrom and Kukla, Fran and Ollie who hypnotized young Baby Boomers in the early days of television.

Of course the Bears' Walter Payton, as well as Papa Bear George Halas who practically invented pro football. The list of legends is endless.

Chicago is a town built by such legends. You don't have to dig very deep to unearth them in all their many shapes and sizes. To know our legends is to know us and what makes us who we are. The politicians, sports stars, religious heroes, great restaurateurs, actors, news anchors, great business leaders, neighborhood cooks, medical wonders and everyday larger than life pals.

It has never been so important to remember who they are. Our legends, I believe, increase our chances of survival.

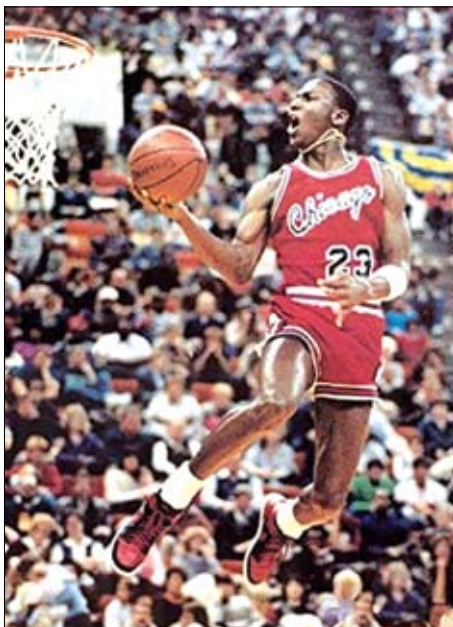
Some legends define a place by their personality, character, decisions made or actions taken. And some legends define the place in which they live. The geography, the myths, the history, the size and contours of the local space.

Some of Chicago's most legendary heroes are easy to identify. They civilized the city. They harmonized town life. They're headline makers, charting the future, paving the streets and lighting the alleys.

Others are record holders or record breakers. They knock it out of park on a daily basis. They swoosh every basket. They're on the green in two. They can harness the wind to fill their sails. Their names are household words.

Chicago's most famous legends are a curious blend of high human ingredients. They're never very far away. That proximity is significant as it keeps those legends close to us.

Top on my list of Chicago legends is Mayor Richard J. Daley, (1903-1976), master politician, maker of presidents, urban genius, city builder, most importantly a man of power who was a man of his word. A product of a meat and potatoes Chicago neighborhood, Bridgeport, he carried the Chicago of everyday people in his heart. A deal maker, he saw prom-

ise written on the face of Chicago and had the guts to make it blossom. He's never been equaled. During the riots of 1968, he stood firm. Ensuring justice was for every Chicagoan. No faint-hearted loyalties. Looking back, 1955 to 1976 are glory years. A lifetime of valued clues to personal achievement on behalf of others. Faithfulness. Service to others. Acting with courage.

Also on the top of my list is Michael Jordan. His career with the Chicago Bulls was about more than basketball championships. He recreated the relationship between sports and new generations of Chicagoans. There is no place in the world you can go where the name Michael Jordan isn't revered. He lifted Chicago to new levels of self-awareness. Friendly, handsome, gentlemanly, skilled like no other player, he became the measure of a new Chicagoan. Elegant, poised, gracious. People were proud to share the city with him. And the wondrous notoriety he brought to Chicago life. Michael taught Chicagoans in everything he did on and off the court. Lessons to be learned about responsibility. Personal integrity. Being generous. And of caring for others.

You also can't tell anyone you're from Chicago without someone's moronic mention of Al Capone. Yeah, that's right, Big Al. The author of much mayhem and murder during Prohibition and the Roaring 20s. Capone is really an "Anti-Legend" I suppose. Guiding the

criminal enterprises of gangland Chicago in its Mafiosa infancy, Capone and his crew orchestrated civic turmoil until the federal government set up their special task force to focus on his gang's enterprises.

He certainly added drama to local life. As well as powerful life lessons about crime and survival in a time of hardship for many.

Capone did go to prison and died after his release. While much of his physical presence has been erased from Chicago's memory, his strange place in our history is symbolized by his grave in Mt. Carmel Cemetery.

If anyone deserves to be a Chicago legend it is Catherine O'Leary, a simple, pious Irish immigrant whose life changed irrevocably in 1871 when a fire in her cow shed on DeKovan St. turned into the inferno we call "The Great Chicago Fire." Poor Catherine was neither to blame for that fire nor responsible for its taking away three-fifths of the city. A parishioner at Holy Family parish on Roosevelt Rd., Catherine was forced to endure the false accusations and untruths published in newspapers across America that she was to blame. She was the press's perfect patsy. A poor immigrant woman. A Roman Catholic. A powerless American, least among its citizens. Catherine had the comfort of her family, but she was broken-hearted by the falsehoods. Some believe she died of a broken heart.

Our Chicago legends are powerful spirits to recall. Memory of them and their accomplishments might just be what we need to bring some sanity again to American life, and encouragement to our willingness to step outside the fashionable left-wing mob of looters and social deconstructionists. The current cycle of blame that many use as a way to combat their own failures has stretched out of control. We'd all be better off if we had more people working in Chicago soup kitchens and food pantries than trying to topple a statue of Christopher Columbus. We'd be more successful participating in a national strategy for healing and hope than in letting

gangs of looters rampage Michigan Ave. shops, leaving broken glass and broken hopes in their path. Or the litany of murders on Chicago streets that are the highest in the nation. It's time for Chicago's failing political leadership to stop hiding what's really unfolding. Pick a legend. Learn a lesson. This isn't Sleepy Hollow. I'd settle for Capone.

A LITTLE HELP: Angelo Pullum was murdered outside his home in the 1400 block of Lunt in Rogers Park, and video of his shooting death has now been shared tens of thousands of times on social media. He was shot on June 28 in a grisly, a broad-day-light murder caught on surveillance camera. But despite all the attention, his devastated family now struggles over how to pay for his funeral. Locals have banded together to help pitch in by creating a Go Fund Me campaign. You too can help them give Angelo a proper goodbye by adding to that fund. Having a loved-one's murder sensationalized on social media is a sad fact of our Internet era. It leaves little room for those closest to grieve as they intended and recover from the indignity of having a death sensationalized. It has been a very bad year for street violence here in Chicago.

THE RUMOR MILL: The story seems to have legs. Two former Israeli commando commanders, retired and living on the Gold Coast, are quietly putting together a "security business" comprised of former commandos, also living in the Chicago area, to strengthen

We're writing to inquire why [Inside Publications] only named seven men of European heritage in [the] list of 300 statues. Does anyone know how many statues in the city are of women, and how many are of Black, Indigenous, People of Color. Aside from the racially offensive statues of Native people, such as the Bowman and the Spearman at Ida B. Wells Dr. and Michigan Ave, how many of the 300 statues were created by women and people of color to honor their/our histories?

We hear the pain and fear in [the reporter's] language of "mobs" "threat" and "destroy." [You make] a specious and incendiary claim that, "many monuments, memorials, and statues have been defaced, burned or destroyed in the last month, in Chicago and nationwide" without providing any details on how many, which ones, located where, and his sources for this claim.

With regards to Columbus, both myself and Sarah were raised in the 1980s-1990s being spoon-fed the dominant narrative in St. Ignatius College Prep history classes. "Those who cannot remember the past are condemned to repeat it" said Santayana in 1905. So many of the statues in Chicago, especially the one of Columbus, must be removed, and can be housed in a museum about white and male supremacy, genocide, and racism in this country.

We need to remember Columbus never set foot on what is now America and he did not "discover" the new world. Millions of Indigenous peoples were inhabiting the lands hundreds of years before his 1492 lost voyage. Any credit given him should start and stop with his sailing achievements only.

History has whitewashed his enslavement, rape, mutilation and murder of Indigenous people and promotes the myth he was a noble explorer. He was far from noble if one reads his own journals which outline his cruelty and violence to the Indigenous population. Classrooms do not teach the destruction of settler-colonialism starting with and following his voyages.

It's time for the myth of Columbus to end as well as the removal of his statue. His encounters with Indigenous peoples were not respectful, peaceful, Christian or noble. The erasure of Indigenous peoples and the start of their genocide begins with Columbus and no one like him should be honored or immortalized with a statue.

Police Beat...

Man shot in Rogers Park drive-by July 9

A 29-year-old man is in good condition after someone fired shots at him from a car in Rogers Park July 9, according to CPD records.

The victim was on the 7300 block of N. Paulina when a gunman rolled up in a car and shot him in the leg. At least one spent shell casing was found at the scene.

Police could not find the victim when they arrived on-scene, but he later showed up at St. Francis Hospital in Evanston with a gunshot wound to his left thigh.

According to police records, the victim has been arrested 13 times in Chicago since 2014, mostly for minor crimes in the Uptown neighborhood. No one is in custody. Area North detectives are investigating.

Man charged with robbing, raping woman in Streeterville

Police have arrested a man in connection with the July 4 robbery and rape of a woman in Streeterville. The man is also charged with performing lewd acts in front of three separate women as he drove around the North Side last week.

Prosecutors charged Juan Sanchez, 37, of Logan Square with felony aggravated criminal sexual assault, felony kidnapping by force or threat, and aggravated robbery in connection with Saturday's attack on the 100 block of E. Huron near the Magnificent Mile.

He is also charged with three misdemeanor counts of public indecency for incidents involving female joggers and pedestrians.

Sanchez is accused of implying that he had a weapon to rob a 37-year-old woman as she walked in Streeterville around 7:10 a.m. July 4. The offender then forced the woman into the back seat of a white Honda Odyssey minivan and sexually assaulted her, police said.

Then, on July 7, several women made separate 911 calls to report a man who was trailing females in a white minivan while masturbating and exposing himself.

Incidents were reported between 5:45 a.m. and 6:30 a.m. by women on the 600 block of W. Belmont and the 3200 block of N. Damen in Lakeview as well as by women on the 2500 block of N. Stockton in Lincoln Park.

Some of the women involved in those cases did not file formal police reports. But one woman who did formalize a complaint later

identified Sanchez as the man who exposed himself from a white van on the 1400 block of W. Wrightwood around 5:45 a.m.

Two other women identified Sanchez as the man who exposed himself to them Monday in the 2800 block of W. Shakespeare at 8 a.m. and in the 2800 block of W. Diversey at 5:32 a.m., according to a CPD spokesperson.

On Wednesday, police caught up with Sanchez in the 5200 block of N. Lincoln, according to a CPD statement.

Edgewater man found dead in apartment refrigerator, with 'signs of trauma'

Chicago police are conducting a death investigation after a 58-year-old Marcus Merge was found dead inside a refrigerator in his Edgewater apartment July 9, a CPD spokesperson said.

Around 10:45 a.m., fire department personnel and police responded to the victim's residence on the fifth floor of Hollywood Towers Condominiums, 5701 N. Sheridan.

The man's body was found wrapped in a bedsheet inside the refrigerator, according to officers on the scene. CPD spokesperson Sally Bown said paramedics reported seeing "signs of trauma" on the man's body.

The Cook County Medical Examiner has determined the victim had been strangled, and appeared to have suffered bite wounds on his neck.

Death investigation launched after woman found unresponsive near NBC Tower

Police are conducting a death investigation after a woman was found dead on a plaza sidewalk outside NBC Tower in Streeterville.

Fire department and police personnel responded to 439 N. Cityfront Plaza at 8:05 a.m. July 6. Paramedics administered CPR to the 52-year-old woman and transported her to Northwestern Memorial Hospital, according to a police department spokesperson. She was pronounced dead at 8:59 a.m.

A witness said the woman was bleeding, and a police report indicates that her teeth had been recently knocked out, but the cause of her injuries was not known.

Man on bail for battery, charged with attacking Walgreens employees

A man who was on bail for allegedly battering two elderly men in Lakeview last Winter is charged with dragging a Walgreens employee by her hair and threatening another store employee with a butcher knife in Streeterville July 7.

Police who responded to the store at 201 E. Huron around 8 a.m. searched the area for a suspect and arrested 33-year-old Travoughtay Williams nearby. Prosecutors said a Walgreens employee

recognized Williams from a previous incident and asked him to leave the premises after he collected some merchandise. Instead, Williams punched the woman in her head and chest, then dragged her down an aisle by her hair, according to allegations laid out in bond court on Wednesday.

Williams then pulled out a butcher knife to ward off a security guard. The female victim reportedly suffered a swollen face, knee pain, and blurred vision.

Prosecutors charged Williams with aggravated battery of a merchant and

Men charged during Boystown street takeover

Felony charges have been filed against a man who allegedly pepper-sprayed a police officer during an unauthorized street party early July 6. Two other men are also facing charges after they were arrested during the event.

Officers responded to the Halsted St. bar strip to close traffic, disrupt fights, and attempt to disperse a large crowd that gathered in the roadway between Belmont and Cornelia avenues late Sunday night.

Around 2:35 a.m., police ordered a large group to leave the 3200 block of N. Halsted and some officers saw Stevonte Hubbard, 19, pepper-spraying people in the crowd, prosecutors said.

When police intervened, Hubbard turned around and pepper-sprayed one of the cops in the face and eyes, according to allegations made in bond court.

The officer was treated on-scene by fire department personnel.

Prosecutors charged Hubbard with felony aggravated battery of a police officer, and Judge John Lyke set his

aggravated assault.

On Dec. 30, 2019, police arrested Williams after he allegedly battered another resident of the Lakeview YMCA, 3333 N. Marshfield. Williams was released on a recognizance bond on Jan. 1.

One week later, Williams allegedly cornered two elderly residents of the YMCA and battered them in an apparent robbery attempt, according to Chicago police records. Prosecutors charged Williams with two felony counts of aggravated battery of persons over age 60 and criminal damage to property. Williams was again released on bail.

On July 8, Judge John Lyke ordered Williams held without bail for violating the terms of a bail bond he received in the January case. Lyke also set bail on the Walgreens case at \$100,000.

DePaul guard uninjured when men shoot up his car in Loop

Three people are in custody after someone opened fire on a DePaul Univ. security guard as he drove near the school's Loop campus July 9. The victim was not injured.

Police said someone shot at the 62-year-old guard as he sat in his car at a red light on Wabash Ave. at Balbo Dr. at 4:18 a.m. He was getting ready to park nearby, according to a CPD statement.

The guard said one of three men who were riding Divvy bikes fired a gun, striking his car four times, but leaving him physically uninjured.

Police searched the area and took three people into custody on the 700 block of S. Wabash. Immediately before the shooting, the three men were speaking with someone who was inside a car, police said. Officers subsequently recovered a handgun from that vehicle, according to CPD. Shell casings were found near the vehicle. Area Three detectives are investigating.

About four hours before the shooting, a different security guard called police after they found three shell casings lying outside a School of the Art Institute of Chicago building on the first block of S. Wabash. No property damage was immediately seen at that location, and the incident has not been linked to the DePaul case.

An armed man got out of one of the sedans and began shooting at the victims' car, striking the woman in her leg and arm, police said.

A 23-year-old man was then shot in the leg when the woman's driver — a concealed carry holder — returned fire, according to police.

The concealed carry holder then drove away with his passenger, but the two sedans reportedly chased them and caused their vehicle to crash into a building on the 100 block of W. Huron moments later.

An ambulance transported the woman to Northwestern Memorial Hospital. The injured man walked into Lurie Children's Hospital for treatment. He was subsequently transferred to Northwestern.

Police were working to determine who shot at the victims. Except for the man who was injured, all of the occupants of the white sedans fled the area, according to CPD.

Eleven people have been shot in River North so far this year — and nine of those happened since May 30, according to CPD records. Only 10 were shot in the neighborhood during all of last year.

Man murdered adjacent to Lathrop Homes

A 27-year-old man who was shot in the head while driving near Clybourn and Diversey on Saturday has died, according to the Cook County medical examiner's office.

The man, whose name has not been released by authorities, was shot as he sat in traffic on the 2900 block of N. Leavitt around 1 a.m. July 11. He was pronounced dead at Advocate Illinois Masonic Medical Center at 4:20 p.m. the same day, medical examiner records show.

No arrests have been made. Area Three detectives are investigating.

Ambulance stolen

Never leave your unattended vehicle running in Chicago. Not even if your vehicle is an ambulance.

That's one lesson to be learned from a weird incident that unfolded near the Magnificent Mile on July 11.

Another lesson: Don't give your car keys to a guy who gets out of an ambulance and claims to be a fireman.

Around 10 a.m., a Lifeline ambulance crew left their rig running outside the Warren Barr Living and Rehab

Center at 66 W. Oak, according to a CPD report. The medics were later stunned to discover that their ride had disappeared.

Lifeline tracked the stolen ambulance via GPS, and cops located it on the 200 block of E. Lake Shore D., just steps from Michigan Ave. No one was inside.

As police stood near the stolen rig, a man walked up to report that a fireman had stolen his car a few minutes earlier. Or, more accurately, someone who claimed to be a fireman had stolen his car.

The 47-year-old man said the thief got out of the Lifeline ambulance, walked up to him, and said he needed the man's car keys so he could move the car for an emergency.

The "fireman" and the victim's white Ford Fusion, bearing Blackhawks plate PAWS1, haven't been seen since.

Police said the man believed the thief was wearing a fireman's uniform, but officers also said the thief was wearing clothes that more closely resembled a construction worker, including a yellow hat and yellow vest.

Some contents of the ambulance were also stolen, police said.

No block parties through Sept. 7

The COVID-19 pandemic has claimed another victim: Chicago's block party tradition. City Hall has just cancelled fun in the streets now through Sept. 7. The Chicago Dept. of Transportation has announced that no new block party permits will be issued, and any permits that were issued last week will be revoked. Following recommendations from government experts to avoid non-essential gatherings and any gatherings larger than 50 individuals, Block Party permits are not being issued during summer of 2020.

The oldest building on the campus opened in 1922 as a Roman Catholic high school for girls. The high school remained open until 1981. Later, it served as an Islamic College. It was placed on the national register of historic places in 1976 and in 1983 was designated a landmark by the city of Chicago.

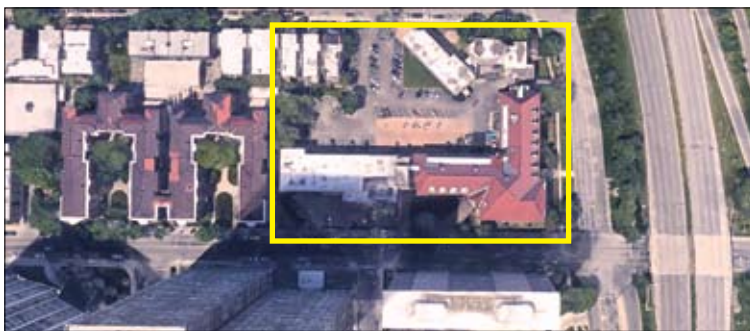
Among those in attendance at the meeting, but who did not present, was Ward Miller, the executive director of Preservation Chicago, a non-profit dedicated to the preservation of Chicago's historical architecture. According to Miller, the historic lakefront campus is worth preserving intact.

Those buildings, designed by architect Barry Byrne, are "an exceptional Landmark building and complex -- and significant architecturally to the world. It is an important building to Chicago, [and] to the Buena Park and Uptown Communities. Byrne was an important figure in the Prairie School movement. He apprenticed under architect Frank Lloyd Wright, and then headed the firm of architect Walter Burly Griffin, when Griffin moved to Australia after winning the commission to design the capital city of Canberra. Byrne is noted for developing his own unique style, and for his work in ecclesiastical architecture and such commissions as "The Immaculata" in both 1922, with additions in 1955," Miller said.

Miller added the character of the surrounding neighborhood, near the intersection of Irving Park and Sheridan roads would change dramatically if the developer's plans had been approved

and built. "We are concerned about the impact of a proposed 23-story, 495 unit building on The Immaculata complex - a Designed Chicago Landmark, along with the repercussions of the proposed tower on such buildings as the neighboring "Paddington Apartments," the Buena Park Community, and the larger community. We are hopeful that any proposed development on this site will be ultra-sensitive to this historic complex. This community certainly has experienced much growth in the past and the blocks of W. Irving Park Rd., near Marine Dr., have been overwhelmed with large and tall high-rise buildings, since the early 1960s, to a point of oversaturation. We need sensitive and holistic plans developed for

each of Chicago's 77 communities, which address such issues as density, historic preservation and quality-of-life issues, looking to our City's future," Miller said.

Founded in 1997, Buena Park Neighbors is the neighborhood association of more than 300 residents and businesses in Chicago's 46th Ward. Buena Park is situated on Chicago's north side, bordered by Lake Michigan (east), Wrigleyville (south), the Uptown entertainment district (north), and Graceland Cemetery (west).

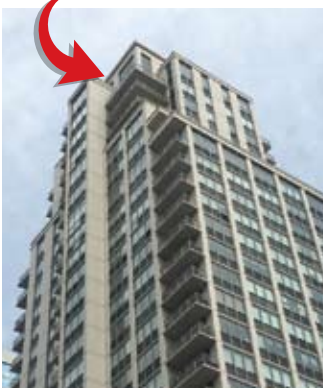
