

## Help is NOT on the way for State St.

**Ald. Reilly calls out police:  
'get this sh\*t under control'**

The two-block stretch of State St. between Kinzie and Illinois is unlike any other in River North. The sidewalk, probably older than any living Chicagoan, is cracked, patched, potholed, and inexplicably dives at a sharp angle toward the street.

A liquor store sign, still offering booze and lottery tickets, hangs over a storefront that was long ago boarded up and closed off by a metal gate. But, this being River North, there's a cherry red Jaguar convertible parked in front of it. With a parking ticket.

Poorly lighted at night, this 700-foot stretch of bar hoppers, drug dealers, and random hustlers will leave even veteran city dwell-

ers with the unmistakable feeling that they're being sized up.

And it's been like that for years. Local Ald. Brendan Reilly [42nd] calls it "The Lawless Zone."

He says he's been writing to mayors about the problem — Daley, Rahm, and, now, Lightfoot — for 14 years.

"The recent shooting incidents, fighting and robberies that have occurred this week are extremely concerning; the violence in the Central Business District has gotten out of hand," Reilly warned his constituents in his weekly newsletter.

"CPD still won't dedicate foot patrols there. Sadly, aldermen can only offer advice and request resources," he said on Twitter Thursday. "The mayor runs CPD."

The alderman called the area "drug and gang hotspots," noting

that the stretch of State St. north of the Chicago River continues to go unprotected. The daily violence in Chicago is now part of news reporting in cities across the globe, and is suffocating what little remains of the once booming meeting, convention and tourism businesses Chicago enjoyed only a few years ago.

Reilly was responding to comments that followed a double shooting earlier in the day at Illinois and State — steps from where two men were savagely beaten and robbed in the middle of the street on Aug. 29. "I'm not a cop, but this ain't rocket science: put foot patrols back in River North to get this sh\*t under control," Reilly said.

The block where the men were beaten has been the scene of two

## A step in the right direction, covering its tracks, or both?

**Hard to know  
Park District's motives  
for crass move**

While the Chicago Park District hustled to re-paint the completely faded no swimming warning signs on the pier at Pratt Ave., the mother of Miguel Cisneros Jr. — the 19-year-old who drowned there on Aug. 22 — called on Mayor Lori Lightfoot to instruct the CPD to install life rings, signage and safety equipment at all of the city's beaches.

Maria Diaz wants to insure that the unimaginable tragedy that happened to her beloved son does not happen to another family. I truly hope the mayor and CPD listen.

This isn't just a Rogers Park issue, although for a couple of years now the alderman, activists and residents of my neighborhood have been begging to see this happen. This is for people — citywide — who swim in the lake or have lost a person they care about to drowning. Each and every neighborhood in Chicago with a beach or a pier or a break-

water structure needs to properly warn its residents, in every way possible, not to swim there.

Residents and community activists have tried for years to plead with the CPD for signage and life-saving equipment, including Rogers Park's new alderman Maria Hadden [49th].

Last week, exasperated Rogers

Park neighbors, fed up with CPD ignoring the problem, put up a total of four life rings, all of which were confiscated by the CPD for not being authorized.

How crass that the CPD pulled this Big Brother power play on the very day of Miguel's funeral.

But the good news is, nearly two dozen painted sidewalk signs were painted — or should I say re-painted — up and down the pier.

New signage was installed. And that's all great. It's a step in the right direction.

But what I'm wondering is, who was responsible for the upkeep of the faded painted sidewalk warnings not to swim off the pier that were already in place but were not properly maintained so they became invisible? They haven't been visible for ages. Had they been, perhaps Miguel would have seen them and thought twice about going for a swim off the pier, which was an unfamiliar place to the South Sider.

And who was responsible to make sure the lone sign at the start of the pier was not covered in graffiti? Was anybody minding the fort on this pier?

## Chicago Plan Commission approves mixed-use River North development

Reports of the death of high-density, high-rise living are apparently premature.

At least along the Chicago River, downtown, on the Near North Side, River North, Goose Island and up to Lincoln Park where proposed high-density projects keeps rolling along as if there were no pandemic that chased people out of high-density buildings in March of 2020.

Next up on the plan is a 255-foot-tall, 21-story River North structure by Antunovich Associates, with 178 residential units and over 9,000 square feet of commercial space. Last week the Chicago Plan Commission approved the proposed new devel-

opment for 741 N. Wells St.

From the South Loop north into Lincoln Park, dozens of high-density, high-rise apartment buildings are being proposed that would add tens of thousands of new rental units to the city center. And the concept of creating one new parking spot for each new residential unit seems to be out of vogue. While the new project at 741 N. Wells St. will offer a mix of 70 studios, 68 one-bedrooms and 40 two-bedrooms; parking will be limited to about 50 vehicles on site.

And maybe that's just the market meeting demand, as median

## CPD's 19th Dist. gets new commander

Eighteen months after the previous staff changes, the Chicago Police Dept. has announced a new commander of the Near North police 18th District.

Jon Hein is 50 years old and has been with CPD for 25 years, most recently as Executive Officer of the 15th police district based in the Austin community. Before that, he was a lieutenant for the 24th district in Rogers Park. He was the business liaison sergeant for the 9th district in Deering and a Tactical Team sergeant in the 1st district based in the Loop.

He has a bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from Southern Illinois Univ.

The 18th police District stretches from the main branch of the

Chicago River north to Fullerton Ave., and from Lake Michigan to the north branch of the river.

Hein replaces Jill Stevens, who is now Deputy Chief of Area 3. Daniel O'Shea, who before Stevens had also been promoted from 18th District commander to Deputy Chief of Area 3, is now Deputy Chief of the Criminal Networks Group.

Spt. David Brown announced the promotions on Sept. 1. He says the changes follow recent retirements within the department's executive ranks.

"These leaders represent the highest levels of professionalism and commitment, and I am excited about the paths they will forge in their new positions," said Brown. "I have the utmost confidence in them as they continue working to make Chicago a safer city."

I also could hear it in the unusual questions visitors were seriously pondering as they ate their lunch on the patio at Ralph Lauren Bar & Grill. They were trying to wrap their minds around our heartbreaking tragedy of leader-

ship here. Hard for them to reconcile with conditions in their native Belgium. I pointed them in the direction of Gucci and Dior, stores heavily hit in the Mag Mile's latest looting escapade. I told them to take a cab there. But warned them to stay away. For their own well-being.

I'm not sure there's enough fresh blueberries left to keep me sane and calm. Just witnessing the mayhem of the moment is difficult to watch. My antioxidant level may be high still, but it can't last. Maybe I just need a beer, some Tufano's clams or some RL crab cake.

Or maybe just the hope that one day foreign tourists will once again return.

And when some new faces will be at work in Chicago's political leadership offices currently held by "Double-Double. Toil. And Trouble." Shakespeare knew of what he wrote.

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# The last march for Lincoln Square?

## German-America Fest celebrating its centennial year, kick off Sept. 10

**One of Chicago's oldest cultural festivals, now threatened by rigged real estate deal**

The Lincoln Square German-American Day festivities run Sept. 10 through 12 centered in Lincoln Square, at the corner of Lincoln, Leland and Western avenues.

The festival will offer German hospitality in two large tents every day with three bands playing traditional Oktoberfest music.

Now celebrating its 100th year, the Germanfest is one of Chicago's most popular, and long-lasting cultural festivals, annually drawing large crowds to the community that was founded by European settlers and immigrants.

But the fest's future fate now faces the most dire challenge to its survival since World War II, due to a rigged real estate deal being fronted by Ald. Matt Martin [47th].

One of the highlights of Germanfest is the annual Von Steuben Parade that steps off on Lincoln Ave. 2 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 11, marching from Irving Park Rd. north to Eastwood Ave. That Parade may step off in Niles in 2022.

Authentic German food and traditional drinks will be served and visitors can expect much dancing to the lively European folk music from German bands, making for what Germans call "Gemütlichkeit." For youths, there will also be an amusement section of the fest with carnival games.

But for those who have never enjoyed the local Gemütlichkeit, you might want to put this year's festivities on the calendar as Ald. Martin has threatened its viability by offering to give away for free a section of the festival grounds it operates on... six city-owned lots centered at 4715 N. Western Ave.

The alderman is fronting for the secretive insider real estate deal, and now taking heat from his own constituents for offering to give it away for free to a Boston-based real estate developer - The Community Builders [TCB] - so they can build a 51-unit apartment building on the site.

The deal was negotiated in secret during the summer of 2019, and was leaked to this newspaper by a City Hall staffer in Nov. 2019. In those two years this newspaper has identified only a couple dozen people who openly support the deal, many whom don't even live in the 47th Ward.

The property was originally taken by the city in an eminent domain action in 1975. It has been used for nearly 50 years as a critical piece of commercial infrastructure, as a public parking lot that serves the entire Lincoln Square commercial district. The lot is a key component of operating the German-American Festival, Maifest and Applefest, serving as defacto festival grounds. The lot also serves as primary customer parking supporting the popular Lincoln Square Farmer's Market.

The transaction appears to be connected to City Hall insiders as one of TCB Board members - Patrick Nash - is the scion of some of the oldest clout in Chicago. And now Ald. Martin is providing cover to TCB by helping them to gain millions of dollars in new wealth courtesy of the taxpayer, and by putting at risk a big part of the cultural heritage that made the neighborhood so desirable today.

But perhaps more importantly for Ald. Martin's political future, Nash is the grandson of the late Patrick A. Nash, co-founder of Chicago's Kelly-Nash Democratic Machine. That machine dominated Chicago politics and government from 1933-1947

and became the basis for the political machine operated by the late Mayor Richard J. Daley.

Nash, who lives on the North Side, served on the city of Chicago's Dept. of Housing Advisory Committee, and as a member of the board of commissioners of the Chicago Housing Authority. He is also a past president and Chairman of the Affordable Housing Investor's Council.

Nash once worked for Chase Bank, and may now be serving as the syndicator for several of TCB's development projects in Chicago, including the Lincoln Square deal. Syndicators peddle secretive Section 42 Affordable Housing tax credits to wealthy investors. Nash is a very influential part of the financial network that utilizes Low Income Housing Tax Credits [LIHTC] to build housing projects, over the years working with some of the largest investors in the field.

City Hall never posted a Request for Proposals for the property in question, has never put the site up for sale, and no

other developers were ever considered for the multi-million-dollar gift. The alderman refuses to say publicly why an out-of-state developer was chosen, and public documents released by City Hall after Freedom Of Information requests came blacked out. The alderman and his staff stopped talking to this newspaper shortly after we started reporting on the plan.

Perhaps fearing the loss of the German-American festival, in August, Ald. Martin held a private - off the record - meet-

ing with festival organizers, where he asked if they could make special considerations and perhaps shift the festival footprint to make way for TCB's apartment building.

But the prominent German clubs behind the event recently purchased a new clubhouse in suburban Niles, and could easily relocate the festival out of the Lincoln Square neighborhood, and out of the city, should they choose.

Everyone concerned may find out soon if the city will end up giving the lot away for free to TCB, as the Dept. of Housing is expected to issue the final round of LIHTC at the end of September. Those tax credits, and the potential millions that may come from additional Tax Increment Financing funds would make the deal incredibly lucrative for TCB. A back of the envelope ciphering shows that TCB could expect perhaps a \$10 million or more payday courtesy of the city, local taxpayers and nearby commercial businesses in the wealth transfer.

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## Centennial event looks at Mayor Washington's LGBTQ+ legacy

The LGBTQ legacy of late Chicago Mayor Harold Washington (1922-1987) will be discussed as part of a series of events marking his 100th birthday in 2022. This free event will be 6 to 8 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 13, at the Center on Halsted, 3656 N. Halsted St.

The program will include LGBTQ+ advocates who worked for Washington, served on his Committee on Gay and Lesbian Issues [COGLI], and those who fought for the city's gay-rights law in the 1980s.

Special guest will be state Sen. Mike Simmons [7th], discussing how Washington's legacy as mayor from 1983-87 impacted his own trajectory as the first openly gay Black man elected to a state senate post in U.S. history.

Tracy Baim, the organizer for this event, will speak about covering Washington for the local LGBTQ press. Baim today is president and co-publisher of the Chicago Reader newspaper; co-founder and former publisher of Windy City Times. She received

the 2013 Chicago Headline Club Lifetime Achievement Award, and was inducted into the National Lesbian and Gay Journalists Association Hall of Fame. She was inducted into the Association for Women Journalists-Chicago Chapter Hall of Fame in 2018. She is also in the Chicago LGBT Hall of Fame. She is the author or co-author of 13 books, and producer of three films.

There will be two panel discussions. The first will feature Washington's gay and lesbian liaison, Peggy Baker, and Ann Christophersen, co-founder of Women and Children First Books in Andersonville, who served on COGLI. Human-rights advocate Mona Noriega will moderate the panel.

The second panel will feature three of the four surviving members of what was known as the "Gang of Four"—activists who were among those advocating for the city's gay-rights bill during Washington's administration: Laurie Dittman, Rick Garcia and Art Johnston.

The event will be videotaped for later airing, in case COVID-19 restrictions limit audience capacity.

# Metra to hold virtual meeting Sept. 9 on UP North \$262M bridge project

## Rehab of 11 bridges planned

Metra bridges on the North Side are about to get a major \$262 million overhaul.

Metra will hold a virtual public meeting on Sept. 9 to introduce the next phase of its project to replace 120-year-old bridges along the Union Pacific North Line on the North Side of Chicago. This phase includes the replacement of 11 bridges and retaining walls as required between Fullerton and Addison.

The Metra UP North Rebuild: Fullerton to Addison Project is currently in the design and planning stage with construction expected to begin in 2023 and completion expected in 2027.

The bridges being targeted are 120 years old. Along with the adjacent retaining walls, these bridges have surpassed their functional lifespan and can no longer be economically repaired and maintained.

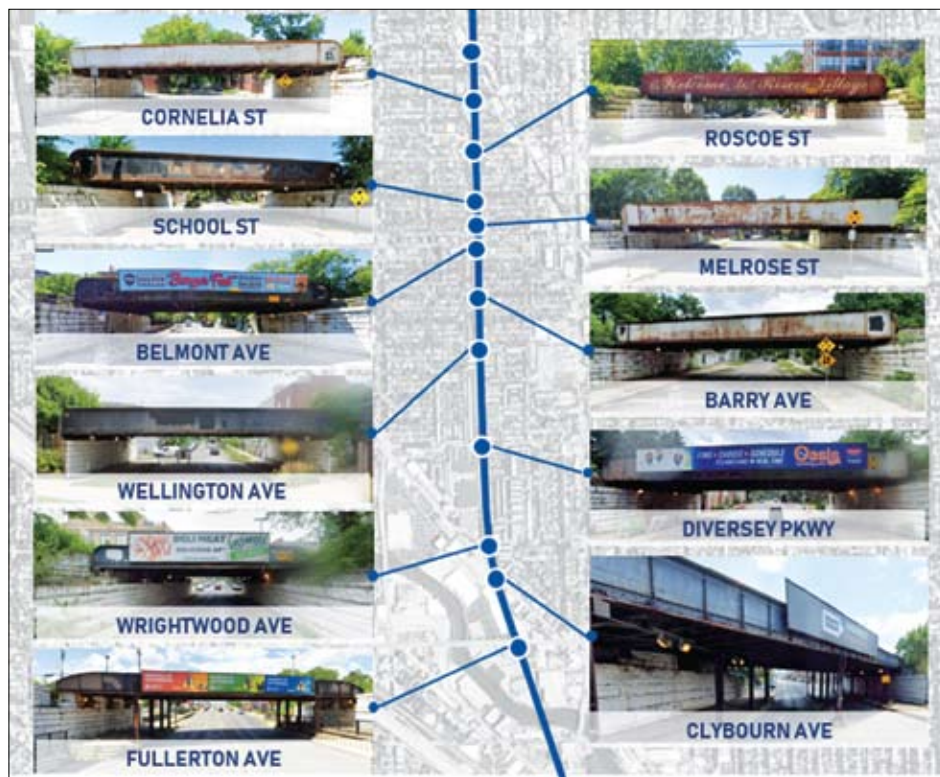
Metra operated 70 revenue trains each

weekday on the UP-N Line with average weekday ridership of 34,600 passengers. The line runs all the way north to Kenosha, WI.

The total estimated cost of the project is \$262.3 million and has been included in Metra's Capital Program for the past three years. Funds totaling \$161.2 million are currently allocated, including \$6 million from federal sources and \$156.1 million from Rebuild Illinois bond funds. Metra continues to pursue additional project funding.

"These bridges have surpassed their functional lifespan and can no longer be economically repaired and maintained," said Metra CEO/Executive Director Jim Derwinski. "The Metra UP North Rebuild Project will modernize the existing infrastructure, reduce maintenance needs and operating costs, and improve the customer experience with increased reliability and resiliency. This project will benefit Metra

# Giant gantry to be used in RPM track reconstruction

Reportedly for the first time by the Chicago Transit Authority, the construction teams working along the Red and Purple Line rebuild will be using a giant gantry during the major reconstruction along the North-South lakefront train lines scheduled to begin this month.

The gantry moves large sections of new track, rails and materials along a giant rail into position for placement. It is expected to be able to do the work more quickly and efficiently, "with less impact on the community," according to the CTA.

The renovation program will

completely rebuild the line between the Lawrence, Argyle, Berwyn, and Bryn Mawr stations,

and the tracks between them. The CTA plans to move the stations slightly from their current sites.

CTA officials closed the stations this spring and hope to reopen the renovated stations by the end of 2024.

They added, however, that some future property acquisition will undoubtedly involve some nearby sites.

"Following construction, we will solicit properties for new retail and residential developments," a CTA official said, adding the sites would be for meeting a hoped-for growing demand for Transit Oriented Developments near the Red Line. City planners hope the now mostly empty CTA buses and trains will have a rebirth, undergoing greater popularity than they have had since the

pandemic and growing criminal activity chased away many public transportation users in the past two years.

So will the CTA help support nearby businesses? So far the CTA has done very little promotion and advertising for the beleaguered businesses. Officials have already done a few small things like start online newsletters and hang "open for business" banners at several locations along the line. But it may take more effort, money and marketing to try and attract customers back to the restaurants, entertainment, and businesses still operating nearby during the work.

## Man drives into CPD station parking lot to escape a running gun battle, gets ticketed

A shoot-out between the occupants of two vehicles directly in front of a North Side police station ended badly for a third driver who tried to escape the gunfire by pulling into the 18th District station's parking lot. Not only did his car get shot, but cops gave him four tickets after he ran into their paddy wagon.

Officers working at the Near North District station, 1160 N. Larrabee, reported hearing shots fired around 12:44 a.m. Sept. 1. They quickly located a 27-year-old Old Town man who was in the station parking lot with his conversion van.

The man told police he pulled into their parking lot to get away from the gunfire that was being exchanged between a green Dodge Charger and a black Dodge Durango as they drove in front of the station. As he entered the police station lot, he collided with a parked CPD prisoner transport truck, according to a CPD report. His van was also struck by gunfire, the report said.

Police surveillance cameras showed the Durango and Charger were actually chasing after the conversion van, according to the report. Neither the van's driver nor his 34-year-old female passenger was injured.

According to police records, officers ticketed the man for driving at an unsafe speed, failure to have a driver's license, failure to have insurance, and failure to have a valid registration.

No one is in custody for firing the guns.

## Lyft driver who sexually assaulted woman gets 66-month sentence

A Chicago man has been sentenced to 66 months for sexually assaulting a woman who fell asleep in the back seat of his car while he worked as a Lyft driver in Dec. 2018, according to court records.

Rimon Kazzoo, 38, pleaded guilty to one count of aggravated criminal sexual assault by force in exchange for the sentence. Judge Thomas Hennelly handed down the sentence and gave him 387 days credit for time spent in jail before trial.

The alleged attack occurred after the 26-year-old victim and a friend left a bar on the 1500 block of N. Wells in Old Town on Dec. 5, 2018. The friend summoned separate Lyft rides for herself and her friend, who was picked up by Kazzoo, Assistant State's Attorney James Murphy said during a bond court hearing last year.

The victim told police that she fell asleep in the back seat as the car neared 31st Street and Went-

worth. Her next memory is waking up while Kazzoo sexually assaulted her in the back seat of his car around 11:05 p.m., according to Murphy and CPD records.

She escaped from the car after striking Kazzoo and scratching his neck, Murphy said. Outside the vehicle, the woman realized that she was across the street from her home, and her pants had been pulled down around her ankles.

Murphy said the woman took swabs of her own fingernails because she knew she scratched the offender. Kazzoo reportedly dropped off the woman's phone, which she left in his car, at a Lyft operations office.

His DNA was found in the victim's private areas and on the clothing she wore on the night of the alleged attack, according to Murphy. When police arrested

Kazzoo on Wednesday, he denied ever touching the victim sexually.

"Safety is fundamental to Lyft, and what the rider described is unacceptable," a spokesperson for the company said Sept. 2. "We responded immediately, banning this driver from the Lyft community and working with law enforcement. We have also been in contact with the rider to offer support."

Kazzoo is scheduled to be paroled on Jan. 17, 2025.

## Paroled home invader is accused of committing murder while authorities let his gun and drug case drift

The Lakeview man who allegedly ran over three people Aug. 29 with his SUV while on probation for killing a 93-year-old Edgewater woman with the same vehicle in 2018 was released from police custody on a recognizance bond and told to show up in court in October.

Rayon Allen was charged with three counts of leaving the scene of an accident, driving under the influence of alcohol, and driving under the influence of an intoxicating compound, which are all misdemeanors, in connection with the crash, a CPD spokesperson said. He was also cited for failure to reduce speed and failure to stay in his lane.

Allen left the police station on his own recognizance even though allegedly running over three people would seem to violate the probation he received on a reckless homicide charge for killing Lorraine Campione with the same BMW X5.

Over the last year we've done some coverage of people charged with committing serious crimes in Chicago while on bail for other serious crimes.

Now a different situation has been popping up more often than we remember: a seeming lack of urgency on the part of judges and prosecutors to address serious allegations against people like Allen, still endangering innocent people's lives after he was given probation for killing Campione with the same car.

The judge in the 2018 reckless homicide case should be reconsidering Allen's probation in light of the new and remarkably similar allegations. But, instead, Allen was slapped with misdemeanor charges and sent home on a recognizance bond. His next court date is set for October.

Campione was walking in the 5500 block of N. Sheridan Rd. around 11:20 a.m. Sept. 24, 2018, when two drivers yielded to allow her to cross a driveway. But Allen made an improper left turn in his SUV, overtook a vehicle on the left, and hit Campione.

Allen continued to drive forward

## Prosecutors charge man in brutal State St. attack

A 33-year-old Wheeling man is the first person to be charged with the brutal beating and robbery of two men in the middle of State St. Aug. 28, police said. Investigators continue to search for at least two more suspects, according to a source.

The beating and robbery on the 400 block of N. State was captured on video as it unfolded around 1:31 a.m.

Police said Brandon Jefferson participated in the attack and stole one of the victim's cars. He's charged with two felony counts of robbery, two felony counts of aggravated battery causing great bodily harm, and receiving-possessing a stolen motor vehicle.

Officers arrested Jefferson on Aug. 30 in the Robert Taylor Homes neighborhood.

after striking her, which caused Campione's body to become wedged under the front driver's side tire. According to witnesses, Allen got out of his SUV and tried to remove Campione by pulling on her leg. When that failed, he allegedly tried to take other motorists' cars. That also failed.

Then there's Emonte Morgan. He was on probation for robbery when he allegedly struck a pedestrian downtown and fled the scene in April. He was arrested and, like Allen, was

sent home on a recognizance bond for misdemeanor charges.

Four months later, a judge still hadn't reviewed his probation status and, on Aug. 7, Morgan shot and killed Chicago Police Officer Ella French, according to prosecutors. He also allegedly shot French's partner, who suffered life-altering injuries.

But the most inexplicable case may involve 25-year-old Justin Cortes, a three-time convicted felon and admitted Latin King gang member who is on parole for home invasion, according to police and court records.

A grand jury indicted Cortes on multiple felonies in June, including Class X armed violence, Class X armed habitual criminal, and multiple gun felonies, but authorities never tried to arrest him. When the case first came up in court during a Zoom hearing in July, the judge continued the matter until August, court records show.

Cortes allegedly decided to pass the time by killing a man.

So, how did this seemingly avoidable cluster unfold? It all started in June of last year. An Illinois Dept. of Corrections officer and Chicago police went to his home for a parole check. They found \$1,800 worth of pot, six individually-packaged ecstasy pills, a loaded and defaced handgun, ammunition, and \$900 cash, according to an arrest report filed by CPD.

Prosecutors charged him with unlawful use of a weapon by a felon and possession of a defaced serial number, among other things. State authorities sent him back to prison for violating his parole by having pro-

Court records show Jefferson received a seven-year sentence for committing an armed robbery with a handgun on the CTA Red Line at Argyle in April 2012.

hibited items in his home. And in Aug. 2020, prosecutors dropped all of the charges stemming from the parole check, court records show.

On Oct. 22, authorities released him from prison again. Not much happened until June 21 of this year when prosecutors asked a grand jury to approve charges for the gun and drugs that were allegedly found in Cortes' home nearly a year prior — the charges that prosecutors dropped when Cortes went back to prison.

The grand jury obliged, returning a true bill for Class X armed habitual criminal and Class X armed violence — two of the state's most serious criminal violations other than murder. They also charged him with being a felon in possession of a firearm while on parole, possession of a defaced firearm, and other counts.

The new case was assigned to Judge Thomas Byrne. He held a hearing via Zoom on July 8, during which he scheduled another hearing for Aug. 18.

Cortes didn't show up for that court date because he was busy being arrested for murder instead.

### A killing

Around 9 p.m. on Aug. 6, Angel Figueroa was riding in the front passenger seat of a van with his girlfriend in the driver's seat and his daughter in the back seat. As they headed down the 3400 block of W. Division, Cortes pulled up next to them in a silver Santa Fe and fired one shot, Assistant State's Attorney James Murphy said.

Figueroa's girlfriend heard the shot, saw the Santa Fe speed away, and then realized Figueroa was slumped over in his seat. He died from a single gunshot wound to his face.

Investigators used a series of private and public surveillance cameras to track the Santa Fe and identify Cortes as the driver based on, among other things, his face tattoos and jewelry, Murphy said.

Police arrested Cortes on Aug. 18 — the same day he was supposed to appear in court on the grand jury's charges. The next day, Judge Susana Ortiz ordered him held without bail for first-degree murder.

Cortes doesn't qualify for our growing list of people who've been accused of committing heinous crimes in Chicago while on bail for a felony because the judge never got around

to actually setting bail. So, he'll have to settle for a dishonorable mention.

## Four teens charged with attempted robbery near Loyola's Water Tower campus

Four juveniles face felony charges after they tried to rob an 18-year-old man near Loyola University's Water Tower campus Aug. 31, according to Chicago police.

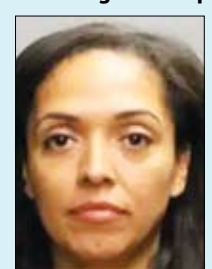
The boys, ages 14, 15, 16, and 17, tried to rob the victim at State and Pearson shortly before 9 a.m., police said.

A Loyola Univ. police officer apparently came upon the robbery and arrested one of the offenders on the first block of E. Pearson. Chicago police officers who responded to an "officer in distress" call arrested three more, according to initial information.

It is not clear if the victim is affiliated with Loyola. However, the area is home to the school's downtown campus, and the teens were arrested outside a building that houses the Loyola student newspaper, among other offices.

Loyola's campus safety office had not posted any information about the incident to its information page as of Tuesday evening. No further information was available about the teens because they are juveniles. They are each charged with one count of attempted robbery.

## Woman shot man outside River North bar following intense provocation

A woman shot a man on a River North street corner, then followed him for two blocks and shot him again at point-blank range as bystanders tried to help him outside a bustling tavern, prosecutors said Aug. 31.

Judge John Lyke ordered Maria Gomez held without bail after her defense attorney said she acted out of "intense provocation."

CPD surveillance video shows a woman wearing a leopard print dress firing a gun at 455 N. LaSalle 10:21 p.m. Aug. 29, shortly before the 32-year-old victim walked up to a group of people outside Boss Bar, 420 N. Clark, and said he'd been shot in the neck, Assistant State's Attorney Darryl Auguste said.

As three bystanders treated the bleeding man's injury, a woman in a leopard print dress walked up and shot the victim again at point-blank range in his back. Once again, the shooting was captured by surveillance cameras.

Police responded to the sound of gunfire, and witnesses directed them to Gomez, who was wearing a leopard print dress and flip-flops about a block away on Kinzie St., Auguste said. Cops allegedly found a loaded handgun in her purse. One shell casing was found outside the bar, and five more were found on LaSalle St.

Auguste said the second bullet entered the victim's back, lacerated his liver, and exited through his abdomen. The man underwent surgery.

Gomez is charged with attempted first-degree murder and aggravated battery by discharging a firearm.

Auguste said she was convicted of misdemeanor battery in 2015 af-

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# Chicago speed traps near quiet parks, not the Dan Ryan

It was a beautiful, warm May night, perfect to be a spectator at the over-60-year-old 16-inch softball league under the lights at the community park in northwest suburban Elk Grove Village.

Keith Dickens, 67, one of this writer's softball buddies—a future Hall-of-Fame player who once starred on “Vintage Risk”—got three hits and his team

won big.

After the game, two other Vintage Risk old timers, John Clausen, 77, and Dean Karouzos, 74, masked-up and joined me at the nearby Coach's Corner saloon for pizza and a few libations to celebrate the victory.

Passing through a “Park Safety Zone” near Merrimac Park at 6226 W. Irving Park Rd. at 9:54 p.m. on the way back to Old Town, this senior-citizen driver was corralled by Mayor Lori Lightfoot's “Automated Speed Enforcement” network.

On July 18, a \$35 speeding ticket for going a mere six miles over the 30-miles-per-hour limit arrived in the mail. The ticket, supported by three, dark and out-of-focus speed camera photos, issued the following terse announcement:

“These recorded images are evidence of a violation of a speed restriction. The vehicle identified above bears a license plate registered or leased in your name. You must pay or contest by Aug. 15, 2021.”

**An automated-money grab?**

In the first two months of Mayor Lightfoot's automated-money grab, some 162 speed cameras, including 69 in “safety zones” within an eighth of a mile of a Chi-

cago school or park, issued 322,447 of the \$35 tickets, which will bring in \$11.3 million to city coffers if the violators pay all the fines, reported the Chicago Tribune.

That's nearly a whopping 17-fold increase over tickets issued in those same months in 2019, when the city was issuing \$35 citations for going exactly 10 mph over the limit, and 19,480 such tickets were issued. Drivers caught on camera at higher speeds receive \$100 tickets.

That dough will fill a nice hole in the city's \$733 million budget shortfall, even though they're really supposed to be splitting the fee with

reconstructing underpasses with increased lighting and ADA accessible travel paths; lowering of Roscoe and Cornelia streets to maintain current clearance under the UP North Line and the CTA Brown Line; refurbishing and painting of the existing Lincoln/Addison bridge; and some utility work along the project corridor.

promised for down the road, will include eliminating the columns under the streets, a longtime annoyance to many motorists and even pedestrians.

Cook County. (When you agree to pay up early to a city “administrator,” with no ‘official’ court hearing, you have essentially agreed to bribe the city to not inform Cook County Courts about your law-breaking.)

On the positive side, the money may eventually benefit thousands of tax-weary Chicago homeowners who expect to be slapped with huge real estate tax increases next summer.

Mayor Rahm Emanuel created the speed camera program in 2013, after the Illinois Legislature gave him power to install up to 300 of them. The over \$2 million in bribes City Hall staffers accepted helped move the installation along quickly. However, Emanuel ordered the city to set the cameras to cite cars speeding exactly at 10 mph over the limit—not six miles.

Senior citizens on a fixed income and young people who are scratching to pay apartment rents say the mayor is trying to balance her broken budget on the backs of struggling Chicagoans.

**Dan Ryan Speedway?**

While the city of Chicago is cracking down on law-abiding drivers who happen to go six miles over the speed limit, apparently the city and state police are ignoring drivers on the Dan Ryan and Eisenhower expressways who exceed the 55-mph speed limit by more than 50 mph.

Based on the \$35 fine for speeding six miles over the limit, 50 mph over the limit should net these speeders a fine of \$300—not to mention the fines for reckless driving.

While returning from out of town one night around 8 p.m., this writer witnessed speeding on the Dan Ryan resembling the Indianapolis 500 race. Dozens of souped-up “muscle cars” with tinted windows were drag racing by at 100-plus miles per hour, while normal drivers were barely doing 50 mph and nervously clutching their steering wheels with white knuckles. Motorcyclists

are famous for this behavior too.

Apparently, the city and state police are so under-manned they can't deal with the rogue gang-banger speeders. Assuming there are a cluster of five gang-banger cars - or 30 bikes - each occupied by four gang members speeding at 100 mph, it would take a large posse of police cars occupied by two officers each to pull over and stop the reckless offenders. And then hope and pray to not get shot.

Conclusion: There simply is no speed limit on Chicago's expressways because they are ruled by armed gang bangers and the police are afraid to confront them because they deal in hot lead.

Fact: There have been 159 expressway shootings in the first eight months of 2021, more than double the same period in 2019.

Finally, the state of Illinois recently allocated \$12.5 million for installation of 300 high-resolution speed cameras on expressways across Chicago and Cook County to provide “crystal clear” license-plate photos. The camera installation started in late August.

Two problems with this unfocused plan. The \$12.5 million budget is a drop in the bucket to stop rampant speeding and gun play. And, many of the speeding shooters are driving stolen cars, so what crimes are we solving?

Apparently, there's a new sheriff in town: the gangs.

## Secrets of the Alfred Caldwell Lily Pool

An open house for the Alfred Caldwell Lily Pool will be held Oct. 16 - 17, to celebrate the Conservancy's 20th anniversary of the restoration of the Alfred Caldwell Lily Pool, a project that earned the site Chicago and National Historic Landmark status.

The Lily Pool began 1,000 years ago when the glaciers retreated from Chicago and left behind miles of beaches and sand dunes, not unlike what visitors see at the Indiana Dunes State Park. In Lincoln Park, the sandy dunes alternated with wet lowland swales where poison ivy thrived, but little else did well. In one of these lowlands, the City built the first lily pool in 1889. This was an artificially heated, brick-lined pool where exotic lilies grew in abundance, producing "gorgeous blossoms of many hues."

Over time, though, the tropical lilies proved hard to cultivate and the Victorian lily pool fell into disrepair.

In 1936, the Works Progress Admin. funded improvements to Lincoln Park, including a plan to redesign the Lily Pool. A young landscape draftsman for the Chicago Park District, Alfred Caldwell, re-conceptualized the lily pool as "a sanctuary of the native landscape." His vision for the Lily Pool is even more relevant now than it was when he created it 85 years ago.

At 12:15 p.m., on Sept. 2, I emailed a few questions to the CPD and by Tuesday morning I'd still not heard back from them. Besides asking the question of when the last time the pier's signage had been refreshed or re-painted, I asked the following. Question #1 is based on a generic statement that the CPD released saying they were exploring options for "supplemental equipment."

1. When do you think the park district will be making a decision on the supplemental equipment? And what equipment is it supplementing? Are there any lakefront beaches or piers that have safety equipment already in place?

2. There was a park district employee on the pier painting 2x2 white squares with red Do Not Swim figures on Sept. 2. A neighbor asked if that was glow in the dark paint because if not, the paint won't be visible once the sun goes down and many people swim at night. Am I accurate to say it's not glow-in-the-dark?

Still hoping to get the answers. Just an FYI, nine people have died in Lake Michigan in Chicago in a one year period. With the exception of one female, the rest were young men spanning in age from teens to mid-30s.

On Tuesday evening, a candlelight vigil was scheduled to be held on the pier with several speakers, including Miguel's mother (And Miguel's cousin met with the CPD last week to discuss signage). Be sure to read next week.

Miguel was not the first person to lose his life in Lake Michigan and sadly, he will not be the last. But you can rest assured that Rogers Parkers are doing our very best to make sure his death was

not in vain.

**Remembering 9/11...** Twenty years ago, a former editor of this newspaper, Beth Burmahl, took one of the last photos of the World Trade Center intact. It has become an iconic remembrance of the Twin Towers. I caught up with Beth to ask how she felt about it two decades later.

"It truly doesn't feel like any time has passed and I think that's because the whole country carries that day with us all the time," said Burmahl, who was my Lerner Newspaper editor at the time. "Even 20 years later I don't have distance from it... I think that black, choppy water and dark sky on the 10th perfectly foreshadowed the entire next day, I don't think that was an accident..."

Free and open to the public, "Eleven," a concert for remembrance and reflection, will be held at 3 p.m. Sept. 12 at the Shrine of All Saints at Sts. Martha and Isaac Jogues Parish, 8523 Georgian Ave. in Morton Grove.

The show has an amazing lineup of some of our finest cabaret and concert artists, including: Cathy Glickman, Carla Gordon of Buena Park, David Edelfelt, Beckie Menzie of Edgewater (also musical director), Gold Coaster Tom Michael, Uptown resident Kevin Wood, and 3-4 The Road & Friends.

The group will reflect through music, stories, and personal memories of the 9/11 events on its 20th Anniversary. "We will honor those we lost and explore how America and our community moved on but never forgot," said Gordon, who conceived the show, which was first performed 10 years ago at the Illinois Holo-

caust Museum in Skokie.

ter biting someone's finger off during an argument. The case was originally charged as felony aggravated battery causing great bodily harm, but prosecutors agreed to downgrade the offense in a plea deal.

Gomez was reportedly acting under intense provocation when she shot the man. The State claimed the victim approached Gomez and her girlfriends outside a bar, struck Gomez's shoulder and chest, and followed the women before he was shot.

**Two shot in River North — directly under the CPD camera**

Two men were shot in River North Sept. 2, directly underneath the CPD surveillance camera that recorded a viral video of two men being beaten and robbed last week in the middle of State St.

Thursday's shooting occurred under that police camera, perhaps 50 yards from where the two men were attacked on Aug. 28.

Unfortunately, the camera's lens was pointing away from the shooting, so it didn't record the latest crime.

The victims were shot after they got into an argument with a man who was in a gray Pontiac Bonneville at 5 E. Illinois, according to an initial CPD report.

Police said a 33-year-old man was taken to Northwestern Memorial Hospital in good condition with a gunshot wound to his thigh. He has been arrested 10 times in Chicago since 2014, mostly for narcotics and domestic violence, according to CPD records. None of those arrests were in the downtown area.

The other victim, a 30-year-old man who suffered a gunshot wound to his back, was taken to Northwestern in a car. He was in serious condition. CPD records show he has been arrested in Chicago five times since 2015, including once for being a felon in possession of a firearm. Those arrests include one on the 400 block of N. State for disorderly conduct, narcotics, and resisting police in 2016; narcotics at Chicago and Dearborn in 2017; and resisting police at LaSalle and Grand in 2017.

According to court records, his gun arrest stemmed from a "shots fired" incident in the Cabrini Green neighborhood during the summer

of 2018. In that case, he allegedly fought with a housing authority security guard who saw him leaving the area of the gunfire. The guard took him into custody and recovered a firearm.

Police said the gunman who shot the victims is a Black male who has dreadlocks.

**Knife attack leaves River North bank worker critically wounded**

A River North bank employee is in critical condition after a man stabbed her in the neck Sept. 1. Police arrested a suspect and recovered a knife in the Loop later in the day.

The assailant entered Chase bank, 600 N. Dearborn, and had a "brief conversation" with the 24-year-old woman before suddenly stabbing her in the neck around 11:12 a.m., police said. Paramedics took the victim to Northwestern Memorial Hospital.

Several witnesses reported seeing a man wielding a large knife as he walked through River North after the attack. They said he appeared to be mentally disturbed and possibly homeless as he ranted and threatened to stab people on the street. A surveillance image from one such assault on the 400 block of N. Dearborn was shared with this reporter by a source. "There has been an incident at one of our branches near downtown Chicago today. Our thoughts right now are with our employee and their family," Chase said in a statement.

Around 3:45 p.m., a CPD unit spotted a man who matched the offender's description and took him into custody at 3 N. State St. Officers also seized a knife.

**Carjacking victim refuses to press charges against teen (who already has four armed robbery cases pending)**

A driver who had a gun pressed to his forehead by a carjacker outside a North Side grocery store Sept. 1 refused to press charges against the man who apparently took the car because the vehicle was still in good condition when police recovered it for him. That's according to a source with knowledge of the case.

The 18-year-old that he refused to pursue charges against has four armed robbery cases pending in juvenile court and had a loaded handgun in his waistband when cops found him next to the stolen car downtown, according to prosecutors.

Around 7 p.m., the 44-year-old victim was sitting inside his parked, running car on the parking lot of Cermak Fresh Market, 6623 N. Damen, according to a CPD report. Suddenly, a man opened his passenger door and got inside. The intruder pressed a handgun to his forehead, demanded his valuables, and then told him to get out, the report said.

He complied, and the offender drove away with his silver Toyota Camry, according to CPD spokesperson Kellie Bartoli. While officers were speaking with the victim, cops in the 1st (Central) Police District spotted the man's stolen car at a BP gas station, 50 W. Ida B. Wells.

Traigan Martin, 18, was standing outside the car and moved inside the gas station when he saw police arriving, prosecutors said Sept. 2. Cops followed him inside, ordered him to raise his hands, and recovered a loaded handgun with an extended ammunition magazine and a laser sight from his waistband.

But when the victim realized that his car was still in good condition, he declined to pursue charges, according to a source. Bartoli confirmed that the victim refused to prosecute, but she did not give a reason for his decision.

Cops arrested Martin anyway for the gun he allegedly had in his waistband. He's charged with aggravated unlawful use of a weapon.

Prosecutors said during his bond court hearing that he has four pending armed robbery cases from before his 18th birthday. They did not provide details of those allegations. An assistant public defender said Martin has a two-year-old child and attended Legal Prep Career Academy.

Judge Arthur Willis ordered Martin held on a juvenile warrant and set bail for the gun charge at \$25,000. Willis said Martin would need to post a \$2,500 deposit to get out of jail on electronic monitoring after the warrant is resolved.

Wednesday's victim is not the first person to forgive an armed carjacker this year.

On Feb. 3, a 28-year-old man was carjacked at gunpoint while shoveling out a parking space in West Town. Police arrested John Daniels, 19, as he drove the stolen car a short time later, according to a CPD report.

While police were processing Daniels at the station, the victim's driver's license, debit card, and medical marijuana card fell out of his pants, the report said. But the victim decided not to

pursue charges because he "felt sorry for" the people who took his Lexus because "they probably need a car."

Less than four months later, Daniels took an 11-year-old boy to Uptown, where they violently carjacked another man.

That victim, a 59-year-old man, was viciously beaten and suffered a broken orbital bone, prosecutors said. Video allegedly shows Daniels standing over the fallen man and taking keys from his hand. The Uptown victim pressed charges.

**Two shootings in Old Town leave four injured, one dead**

Police are investigating two shootings Sept. 2 that left four people injured and a fifth dead in Old Town. No arrests have been made.

Around 10:45 p.m., a man and woman were walking toward a home in the 1300 block of N. Cleveland when about three people chased them onto the porch, and at least one of the offenders began shooting.

The man, identified as Mohammad Habib, 24, suffered gunshot wounds to his torso and was pronounced dead at Northwestern Memorial Hospital. The woman, believed to be about 23-years-old, was taken to Stroger Hospital in serious condition with a gunshot wound to her shoulder.

Then, around 2:23 a.m. Sept. 3, three people were shot outside on the 1300 block of N. Hudson. Police said the victims were uncooperative, and CPD had little information about what happened.

According to a media statement from police, a 41-year-old man was taken to Stroger Hospital in critical condition with gunshot wounds to his hip, lower back, and leg.

The second victim, a 40-year-old man who was shot one time in each shin, is believed to be the first victim's brother. He was taken to Northwestern Memorial Hospital in fair condition.

Police said the third victim walked away from the scene with a graze wound to his leg.

Area Three detectives are investigating both shootings.

Less than a month ago, four people were shot on Hudson directly across the street from the same site.

# Plan Commission OK's 1130 N. State development



The future for 1130 N. State St.

On Aug. 30 the Chicago Plan Commission approved a mixed-use high-rise development at 1130 N. State St., on a corner lot at State St. and Elm streets.

The site is currently occupied by a shuttered Barnes and Noble store and a surface parking lot. The plan also includes the site of the current Lou Malnati's building, which will be redeveloped sometime later, pushing the structure back off the sidewalk to create space for a sidewalk café.

What developer Newcastle Limited proposes to construct is a 345-foot tall, 29-story high-rise. An earlier version called for 42 stories, but Ald. Brian Hopkins [2nd] and the surrounding community rejected that plan in Fall 2019.

The project will now feature 304 rental units and about 10,000 square feet

of ground-floor commercial space. The residences will be a mix of one- and two-bedroom apartments, and as is the custom these days, there will be fewer parking spots than units, with only 132 parking spots included, accessed via a garage entrance on Elm St.

The building is set in three steps. The lowest step relates to the nearby Viceroy Chicago, 1118 N. State St. The upper step relates to 1135 N. Dearborn St. and 4 E. Elm St. The tower height steps up towards the intersection to celebrate the corner. Inset balconies have been introduced into the facade. A drop-off and pick-up area will be located in front of the residential entrance.

The project next needs to pass a referendum vote in the full City Council.

## CTA bus driver shot near Millennium Park, another man injured in road rage shooting near Grant Park

A CTA bus driver was shot near Millennium Park on Sept. 4, just two hours before another man was shot in an apparent road rage incident a few blocks away, according to police.

The 34-year-old bus driver was outside his #20 Madison bus on the first block of E. Washington when he began struggling with a man who walked up behind him, a witness said. The driver fell during the altercation, and the offender shot him one time in the jaw, according to information provided to this reporter.

Police searched the area for the gunman and took him into custody near Jackson and Wabash shortly after the shooting. A gun was recovered, police said. Charges are pending.

Paramedics took the bus driver to Northwestern Memorial Hospital in serious condition. He reportedly suffered significant damage to his teeth and mouth from the gunshot.

Then, around 11:45 p.m., a 28-year-old man was shot as he drove on the 600 block of S. Michigan, police said. The man lost control of his car and crashed into a light pole after he was shot, according to police. He suffered one gunshot wound to his left foot and was taken to Stroger Hospital for treatment.

He described the gunman as a Black male wearing a white hoodie who was traveling inside a white vehicle.

No arrests have been made in the second shooting.

There have been 20 people shot in the Loop so far this year. That compares to

18 shooting victims for the entire year of 2020. Only three people were shot in the Loop during 2019, and prosecutors deemed two of those to be self-defense.

### Carjackings reported in West Loop, near Gold Coast

Police are investigating a pair of armed carjackings that were reported hours apart Sept. 5, one near the Gold Coast and the other in the West Loop.

The first hijacking took place around 5:25 a.m. on the first block of W. Maple. A 37-year-old man was in his gray Toyota RAV4 when a gunman emerged from a white Toyota Camry that blocked him off, according to a CPD report.

Officer Anthony Spicuzza said that the offender demanded the victim's car and

property, then drove away with the SUV. At least two accomplices fled in the Camry. According to initial information, the armed carjacker was a Hispanic man who wore a black hoodie.

Then, another carjacking was reported on the 900 block of W. Washington around 8:55 a.m. A 49-year-old man was walking toward his car when a gray SUV, possibly a Jeep Cherokee, pulled up and a hijacker stepped out with a handgun.

The carjacker pointed the gun at the victim and took control of his Range Rover, which police found about 30 minutes later in a vacant lot on the 1300 block of S. Heath in Pilsen, according to a source.

Detectives are investigating both cases.

murders since 2016.

Marques Gaines, a 32-year-old River North bartender, was knocked out, robbed, and left lying in the middle of State St. on Feb. 7, 2016. Passersby ignored him, and a taxi ran over his body. Long-time felon Marcus Moore pleaded guilty to the attack. He went to prison and got out within five months.

Two years later, seasoned criminal Gino Bassett followed 55-year-old software executive Miguel "Mike" Beedle into an alley on the 400 block of N. State. Moments later, Beedle stumbled back out, clutching his neck, which Bassett had just sliced with a knife. He collapsed and died on the corner of State and Hubbard, perhaps 100 feet

from where Gaines was killed.

Bassett recently received a 22-year sentence.

Less than a week before last weekend's attacks, a River North business owner contacted this reporter, asking us to publish a story about the area's nighttime problems. We didn't.

"The madness on the street and open liquor is out of control. The party on the street has scared away customers," he wrote. "They have taken the street every weekend and turn the street to a block party, drinking in the public way, blocking traffic. We need law and order."

It's not clear what, if anything, Chicago police plan to do about the years-long problem zone. The fact that two men were shot on the street days after a viral video

exposed the area's troubles suggests the answer may be, "not much."

Last week, some media reports have indicated that the Cook County Sheriff's Office would be sending its officers to the area to beef up police presence in response to the latest high-profile incidents.

But on Sept. 2 the sheriff's chief of public safety, Leo Schmitz, told us there's nothing new happening. His personnel have been working downtown about three days a week for months.

"There's a high volume of people, and we try to help," Schmitz said. "The reason this is happening is the sheriff lets us help. He says support [Chicago police] where you can, when you can."

rents in the city for a two-bedroom apartment jumped 1.2% to \$1,423 in August from July, and is up 4% from a year ago, according to a report by Apartment List. The study claims rents have now risen seven consecutive months. They show that vacancy rates are now at an all-time low, and that Chicago's median rent is 14% higher than the national average of \$1,246.

The Wells St. project now heads over to the Zoning Committee and full Chicago City Council for approval.

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
