Private local security firm loses license and NFL contract in Minnesota

"Hundreds and hundreds and hundreds" of personnel problems

A local company that provides security for Wrigley Field, Chicago Gay Pride Parade and the Chicago Marathon has lost its license to operate in Minnesota after an investigation found widespread hiring irregularities, inadequate training and double-billing.

the Minnesota Vikings, has been canceled as a result of the investigation.

"Hundreds and hundreds and

hundreds" of Monterrey's personnel were not adequately trained and licensed according to Richard Hodsdon, chairman of the Minnesota Private Detective and Protective Services Agency Board. The firm also double-billed the stadium and failed to conduct background checks, officials said.

Museum will hide rooftop equipment after neighbors complain

Construction will start "soon" on a solution to hide mechanical equipment on the roof of the Museum of the Contemporary Art [MCA]. Neighbors above the museum say the equipment is an eyesore that will lower their property

Oak - Michigan doghouses going away

In response to the numerous complaints received over the years about the dilapidated condition of the wooden "dog house" covers at the highly traveled intersection of Michigan Ave. and Oak St. the City has started work to remove and replace the wooden 'doghouse' pedway covers, located on the northwest and southeast corners of the intersection.

The 2nd and 42nd Ward offices

have dedicated tax funds from the ward Menus to replace the covers with a more pedestrian-friendly concrete sidewalk slab that will seal off the underground pedestrian passage tunnel-ways that exist below ground at that intersection. The work should be completed in early November, with repairs on each corner anticipated to take two weeks each, weather permit-

Navy Pier flyover project moving into phase two

Construction of the Navy Pier flyover bridge is now moving into phase two. Phase one saw the dedicated jogging and biking lanes removed from its street-level traffic crossings at the Grand Ave. and Illinois St. intersections. This next phase will take that traffic over the waters below on its own dedicated bridge.

Residents and passers-by will now note that additional construction fencing and temporary traffic control signage has been erected as the city prepares for building the leg that will cross over the Ogden Slip portion of the route.

The project got underway in March 2014 and should be completed by Summer 2018. The elevated pathway was designed to

reduce crossing conflicts between lakefront trail users and automobiles going to and from Chicago's Navy Pier and Lake Shore Dr.

The final third phase of the project will replace what may be the single most treacherous stretch of the North Lakefront Trail with a dedicated path above the Chicago River itself. On top of being heavily congested by both trail users and tourists, this stretch also features several blind corners.

The flyover's upcoming extension over DuSable Park and the river also coincides with the cleanup of the 3.3-acre peninsula of contaminated soil left over from Chicago's old Lindsay Light and Chemical Co.

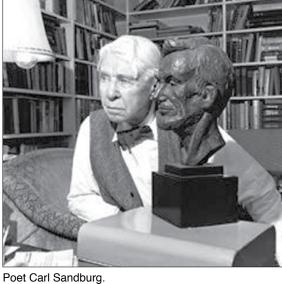

The quirky Irish actor Daniel Day Lewis, celebrated for a lifetime of cerebral cinema success, has spent his life wrapped tight in the world of method acting. That's where the actor kind of becomes the character he portrays. It's intense, a deep, and almost mystical, intimacy with the film role. Over time he has retreated to interests that seem to lift him from the drama of his isolated acting career. He is also a fully accomplished cobbler. He can make shoes from scratch following the ancient method of that trade. He even moved his family to Florence, Italy, some years ago to apprentice at an antique hand-made shoe maker.

Napoleon, historians tell us, relied on his passion for chess to revive him on the military campaign

President Theodore Roosevelt, beyond all his accomplishments, was an avid practitioner of Judo. It is said that at one diplomatic dinner, he tossed the Swiss Ambassador around like a bale of hay.

Charlie Watts of the Rolling Stones has been a diligent student of the American Civil War and has spent some of his fortune amassing an enviable collection of historical artifacts.

America's great 19th century poet, Emily Dickinson, often known as the Belle of Amherst, was prolific. She was also a prizewinning baker, noted for her superb breads.

The Nobel Prize scientist, Madam Marie Curie may have discovered the mysterious element of radium in the Paris lab she shared with her husband, Pierre. But she was also an avid bicycle enthusiast. She rode everywhere. Clocking unfathomable miles flying in every direction.

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart was a musical genius, an 18th century prodigy who performed for emperors and other crowned heads. But did you also know that he was also a superb magician with playing cards? He was taught while recuperating from a childhood illness by a savvy hospital chaplain.

And he amazed and amused his friends with remarkable card tricks throughout his life.

President Thomas Jefferson may have authored the Declaration of Independence and steered the infant American Republic towards its heroic destiny, but he was also a skilled humanist and gentleman farmer. But did you know that he was a skilled violinist? His musical ability is often overlooked by history. But his virtuosity added a remarkable layer of musical aestheticism to his political and diplomatic style.

A few years ago while in Springfield for an Illinois Supreme Court dinner, I was given a private tour of the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library. The Chief Librarian welcomed me and a curator from the Lincoln Collection and walked me through the vaults to see the outstanding treasures of the 16th President's life. It was overwhelming.

After seeing an original copy of the Emancipation Proclamation, I noticed that there were boxes indicating materials belonging to the American actress Marilyn Monroe. I asked how items of the "blond bombshell" wound up in the Lincoln vault. Then I was told of her remarkable connection to President Lincoln.

Apparently the actress had suffered from the absence of a father in her early life. She was said to always be searching for a strong substitute. Apparently she found him in Lincoln. She lamented to her second husband, the American playwright Arthur Miller, that she was never taken very seriously as an actress. Type cast as a blond sex-pot. Miller apparently suggested that she intensify her interest in President Lincoln. And thus empowered her avid collecting of all things Lincoln. She even became friends with Illinois' favorite-son poet, Carl Sandburg, whose biography of Lincoln she had read. In the 1950s they began a friendship that would last until the actress's death in 1962.

Among the items of hers in the vault were a bust of Lincoln and one of Sandburg. As well as many smaller items purchased at auctions of Lincoln materials. There was even a collection of photographs of a meeting between she and Sandberg on a Hollywood soundstage when the poet was acting as a historical advisor on a film. Marilyn Monroe was making a movie at the same studio. Life Magazine sent a photographer to capture the meeting of the actress and the poet. The images of that moment remain semi-sequestered, as the actress did not own the copyright on the photos. So while they can be viewed by the public at times at the library, they cannot be reproduced.

A number of Marilyn Monroe's dresses were included with the Lincoln items sold at auction to the Lincoln Library. One black, knit, off-the-shoulder dress is the one worn by the actress when she met Sandberg in Hollywood. I think it is a great symbol of the actress's yearning for intelligent understanding as a bright thinking woman. She was, in fact, terribly erudite and accomplished. Not at all the empty-headed screen kitten she was portrayed to be. She was well-read and well-spoken.

Sandberg delighted in their friendship. They had, after all, President Lincoln to share.

Studios were still buttonholing actors under contract to them in those days. Often the persona of a star was manufactured by the publicity departments of the powerful studio system. Marilyn Monroe's struggle for wider intellectual understanding and respect demonstrates how complex humans are. We are more than the jobs we do. Or the tasks we perform. Whether we are cracking open radium isotopes, conducting the Chicago Symphony, bagging groceries at Mariano's or smootching on screen with a famous leading man. We need always to reach for wider fulfillment. We need to reach for brighter stars.

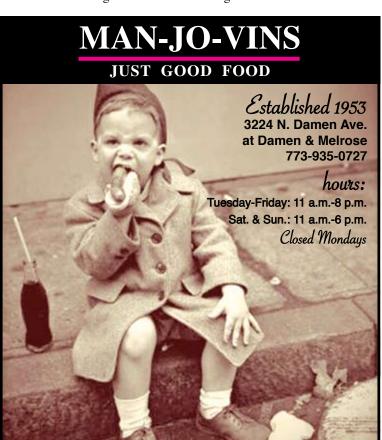

Painting the town pink: The memory of Lynn Sage lives on



Heart of the 'Hood By Felicia Dechter

Lynn Sage was a beloved mother, daughter, wife and friend, as well as a Lake View High School alum. She was diagnosed with breast cancer at the age of 33, and sadly, she lost her battle six years later at age 39.

To honor Lynn and applaud her strength and spirit, in 1985 a small group of her family and friends established a foundation in her name. Today, that foundation -- the Lynn Sage Cancer Research Foundation -- is still alive, well, and thriving. It held its 32nd annual Fall Benefit Luncheon last week at the Hilton, raising more than \$800,000 for breast cancer research, fellowships and educational programs at Northwestern Medicine and the Robert H. Lurie Comprehensive Cancer Center of Northwestern Univ.

I've attended this heartwarming luncheon for many years, but this was my first time there as a breast cancer survivor. As usual, it was an afternoon filled with those impacted by cancer in some way or another, as well as a lot of laughter and a few tears. Also as usual, the emcee, Chicago Sun-Times columnist Bill Zwecker, did an awesome job. So did co-chairs Sofia Ahmad Jones, herself a survivor, and Julie Roth Novak, whose mother and grandma both had breast cancer and who last year lost her 49-year-old sister/best friend Sara Schottenstein -- a mother of three -- to stomach cancer.

"I saw firsthand how research can save people's lives," said Novak, who became involved to honor her sister. "Cancer research is so close to having breakthroughs. Now is the time to fund. It's not a matter of years or decades, it's a matter of days and months that make a difference."

The luncheon began with the PURSE-SUE THE CURE purse auction, which featured more than 200 new, collectible and kid's handbags from top retailers, upscale boutiques and private collections. This year's speaker was Oscar, Emmy and Golden Globe winning actress and two-time cancer survivor, Kathy Bates, whose battle with breast cancer began five years ago.

Bates' mother, aunt and niece all had breast cancer, and Bates had already had ovarian cancer when the breast cancer appeared. One story she told was how she was going to adopt Yorkshire Terriers. But "I just didn't know if I'd be around to raise puppies," she said. When her doctor told her that lymph nodes were involved in both arms, "I went berserk, screaming and crying," recalled Bates, who has lost weight and looks fabulous. "I ran out of the room. Having cancer a second time went from bad to worse."

Day by day, Bates said, she was getting more despondent. "I didn't feel like a woman any more," she said. "There was no

work on the horizon and I was old by Hollywood's standards."

Then one day when she was finally feeling a little stronger, Bates was sitting out in the sun and a little bird dropped in front of her and fell to the ground. Its neck looked broken, its legs were twisted. "I whispered, 'I have the power to heal you,'" she said. The bird flipped over and stretched its little wings. Bates' niece was there and they gave it some water and the bird flew away.

Bates' niece asked her if she had gotten the message. "You thought you were dead and now you're getting a second chance in life," the niece said. "It was a profound moment for me," said Bates. "I was healed and wanted to go back to work."

Ironically, Bates now plays the owner of a medical marijuana dispensary in "Disjointed" on Netflix. "As we say, 'When they go low, we get high,'" she laughed.

"The last five years of my life have been the happiest," said Bates. "My aunt didn't have those years, I'm grateful for mine." She tearfully thanked groups like Lynn Sage for doing such important work and keeping women alive. "It gives me so much hope," said Bates.

"My journey with breast cancer is teaching me that no matter how much time I have left, to savor each moment," she said. "It taught me to be more compassionate. I love to make new memories with those I love. I say yes to invitations I would have said no to."

"I feel like I've gotten younger," said Bates. "And those Yorkshire Terriers, I did get them!"

After her touching speech, Bill Zwecker interviewed Bates, and one question he asked was whether or not she smokes "weed."

"I take the fifth," Bates laughed, then added: "I usually snuggle down in bed and read the next script for 'Disjointed.' It's so much fun." (The next 10 episodes start in January).

As it always has been for me, the luncheon was a reminder of what great strides are being made in breast cancer. It also offered hope, lots of laughter, and reflection time. Many thanks to Margie Korshak and Janie Goldberg-Dicks for having me as their guest. I was tickled pink to be there once again this year.

Be the change... Hats off to 13-year-old Ava Volpe-Santos, a West Rogers Park resident who is founder of Ava's Change4Youth, a unique program of Pride Action Tank (PAT) that will launch today as part of the Andersonville Arts Week.

Loss of mortgage-interest deduction could hurt home-ownership

The mortgage-interest deduction—the bedrock on which the nation's housing policy was built for the past 75 years—may be on shaky ground as the Trump Administration crafts its new federal tax plan.

What is even more surprising, analysts say Capitol Hill real estate lobbyists are divided and fighting among themselves on the future of the coveted mortgage-interest deduction (MID) that potentially benefits 74 million homeowners and creates \$70 billion in annual federal income tax breaks.

Insiders report that the National Assoc. of Home Builders (NAHB) changed its stance on the importance of the mortgage-interest tax



deduction, while the National Assoc. of Realtors(NAR) is lobbying hard for the survival of MID.

'This is the first time in NAHB's 75-year history that we have been open to the idea of broader options regarding housing tax incentives," said Granger MacDonald, NAHB chairman and a Texas builder and developer. "Now is the time to reform tax policy and housing will not be left behind in this process."

Earlier, the NAHB stressed that the mortgage-interest deduction has been a cornerstone of American housing policy since the inception of the tax code.

But after President Donald Trump announced his new tax plan, which would double the standard deduction and eliminate state and local tax deductions, such as property taxes, NAR continued to lobby for MID support, while the NAHB didn't.

Home builders said they voted to revise their policy regarding the nation's tax code in light of recent discussions on tax reform between congressional leadership and the Trump Administration.

"Today's vote gives NAHB greater flexibility as the tax debate unfolds and stakeholders seek consensus to shape a tax code that best serves the nation's consumers and small businesses," the NAHB

"Starting back with the release of the Republican [tax] blueprint about a year and a half ago, it's been clear to us that tax policy is changing," said Jim Tobin, NAHB

chief lobbyist and head of government affairs.

While NAHB has concerns with the doubling of the standard deduction, Tobin explained, "For us, it's an opportunity for our industry to remain flexible in its ability to respond to potential changes down the road."

As the Trump Administration continues to work through tax reform, NAHB said it is promoting the following tax policies:

- A homeownership tax incen-
- The low-income housing tax credit, along with additional resources to meet the affordability
- Tax incentives for remodeling, including energy-efficiency tax
- The exclusion of capital gains on the sale of a principal resi-
- Business interest deductions for small businesses.

Tobin noted that although the NAHB hasn't seen any concrete proposals, the administration has clearly stated that they want homeownership to be a priority going

As a guardian of housing tax incentives, NAHB said it will keep defining that incentive and ensure to homeowners that housing policy is still supported. "Right now, the MID is a middle-class tax break that helped people buy and afford the home they already purchased," said Tobin.

Experts say both the doubling of the standard deduction and the eliminating local and state real estate tax deductions effectively would challenge or erase incentives for homeowners, and potentially inhibit the national homeownership rate which has slipped to about 63% from nearly 70% before the Great Recession.

"We have always said that tax reform-a worthy endeavorshould first do no harm to homeowners," said Bill Brown, president of NAR, who noted that the current Trump tax-reform proposal misses that goal.

"This proposal recommends a backdoor elimination of the mortgage interest deduction for all but the top five percent [of homeowners] who would still itemize their deductions," Brown said.

"When combined with the elimination of the state and local tax deduction, these efforts represent a tax increase on millions of middle-class homeowners." Brown said. "That tax increase flies in the face of a reform effort ostensibly aimed at lowering the tax burden for Americans. At the same time, the lost incentive to purchase a home could cause home values to

An analysis by PricewaterhouseCoopers commissioned by NAR found homeowners earning \$50,000 to \$200,000—thereabout middle class-would realize an average \$815 more in taxes in the year after the proposed reform takes effect, while non-homeowners earning in the same range would see an average \$516 less.

The analysis also found a 10%plus plunge in home values, which could push some homeowners back into negative equity, undoing the recovery.

"Plummeting home values are a poor housewarming gift for recent home buyers and a tremendous blow to older Americans who depend on their home to provide a nest egg for retirement," said Brown.

"Congress can still score a win for American families by promoting lower rates and comprehensive reform that doesn't single out homeowners for a tax hike, while also preserving important investment incentives such as 1031 like-kind tax-deferred real estate exchanges," Brown said.

"Proposed changes-such as the increased standard deduction and elimination of other itemized deductions - mean that many who claim the mortgage-interest deduction under today's tax laws will no longer be able to do so," said Danielle Hale, chief economist at Realtor.com.

"Although the plan recognizes the role of the mortgage-interest deduction in strengthening society via homeownership, other changes in the plan could affect its incentive value, Hale said.

"The proposed tax plan also eliminates most types of itemized deductions, including payments for state and local taxes, which include property taxes. When you consider the total package, many middle-class homeowners are really looking at a tax increase," Hale said.

Daniel D. Mennenoh, president of the American Land Title Assoc., said: "Congress should focus on the potential for tax reform to incentivize faster growth and investment. That goal will not happen unless tax policy continues to promote investment in real estate, which accounts for more than 15% of the nation's gross domestic product."

Celebrating the CTA's 70th Anniversary

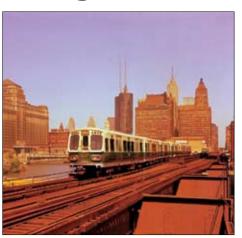
Last week the Chicago Transit Authority [CTA] celebrated their 70th anniversary, and the agency is hosting a yearlong celebration in recognition of the role the CTA has played in the growth and development of Chicago.

On Oct. 1, at the Daley Plaza, residents had the opportunity to ride on 4000-series trains from 1923, as well as 2400-series rail cars from 1976, which were making trips around the Loop, along with a vintage bus from 1960.

CTA officially began operations on Oct. 1, 1947, taking over operations by the Chicago Rapid Transit Co. (who ran the 'L' system) and the Chicago Surface Lines (who ran the streetcar system and some bus

In 1947, a loaf of bread cost 13¢, a gallon of gas cost 15¢, and a new car could be purchased for \$1,300. And in October of 1947, buses and trains in Chicago began operating under a new governmental organization: the Chicago Transit Authority.

Before 1947, several privately-owned companies built and operated elevated train, streetcar and bus lines throughout Chicago. These struggling companies competed with each other for riders, in many places offer-

ing duplicative service that could be operated more efficiently under one umbrella.

In 1945, the State of Illinois passed an act that created the CTA, which consolidated these systems with the goal of providing one unified transit system, one dedicated to operating more efficiently, modernizing the system and doing so as a rider-focused public service.

Soon thereafter, a third company, the Chicago Motor Coach Co. who ran many

bus lines (including a number of lakefront express routes), was later acquired on Oct. 1, 1952, completing the consolidation of mass transit in Chicago under the CTA.

The first 'L' service in Chicago began on June 6, 1892 when a four-car train of wooden cars pulled by a small, coal-burning steam locomotive departed a modest terminal at 39th Street just east of State St. headed for its downtown terminal straight north at Congress St. A year later service

was extended to bring passengers to the World's Columbian Exposition in Jackson

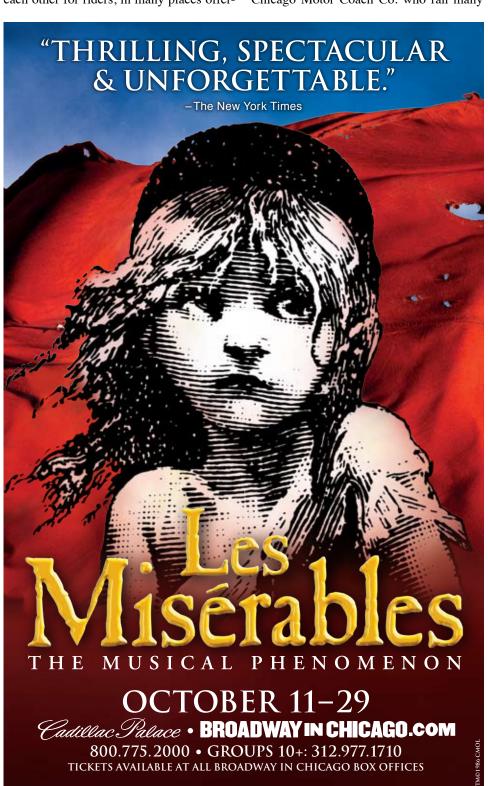
This first segment of the 'L' system lives on today as part of the Green Line—the very first portion of the very first line on what's become a unified system of elevated, atgrade and underground railways that Chicago and neighboring communities have, in many ways, grown up around.

Today's 'L' now has 224.1 miles of track, over which nearly 1,800 train trips are made, logging more than 221,000 miles of travel—all on a typical weekday.

"The CTA will forever be woven into the fabric of Chicago," said Mayor Rahm Emanuel. "The CTA is not only a celebrated part of our City's past, but also a key component to our future."

"For 70 years, Chicagoans have turned to the CTA to get them where they've needed to go," said CTA President Dorval R. Carter, Jr. "Our 70th anniversary gives us the chance to not only look back at our proud history, but also to look ahead to the improvements and investments we're making to serve customers for another 70 years."

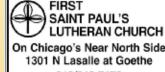

Hazelden marks 20 years in Chicago

Mansion where potheads and winos once congregated, now hosts 37 weekly Alcoholics Anonymous meetings



While addiction treatment is always undergoing improvements, most still work in conjunction with the timetested 12-step program developed by Alcoholics Anonymous, said Hazelden/Betty Ford Chicago executive director Ransom Koska.

The stately mansion at 867 N. Dearborn has gone through a lot of changes since its creation in 1886 by architect William LeBaron Jenney, father of the Chicagostyle skyscraper.

Back in 1917, sometime anarchist Jack Jones bought the building and opened the Dil Pickle Club, a hangout for artists, writers, and aspiring revolutionaries, linking people like Ernest Hemingway and (reportedly) a young Hugh Hefner who worked out the ideas for what eventually became Playboy magazine.

Here also were occasional appearances by Carl Sandburg and John Reed, the Red-leaning reporter who wrote "Ten Days that Shook the World" and ended up being buried in an honored place in Moscow's Kremlin Wall.

During the Roaring '20s, the 'Pickle" was also a sometime speakeasy.

Later - after the Cold War began thawing - it became the Russian consulate.

But Remsen Kasha would probably say the biggest change likely came 20 years ago when the Hazelden/Betty Ford Foundation took over the building.

Founded in 1949 at a Minnesota lakeside farmhouse, Hazelden has grown into one of the world's largest and most respected private not-for-profit alcohol and drug addiction treatment providers, paving the way for its 2014 merger with the Betty Ford Center.

Today where potheads and winos once congregated, there are 3/ Alcoholics Anonymous meetings every week and the city's first Video Gaming Anonymous chapter, said Kasha, the facility's executive director who as of last week also oversees Hazelden's entire East Coast operations.

Kasha said he's seen a lot of growth in the dozen years since he joined the staff when there were only about 10 clients.

Hazelden residence houses up to 13 men and up to 11 women who have to commit to at minimum a three month stay. Two to three people share a room and a bath. Amenities include a family room with a television, refrigerator, and microwave oven. Residents are given access to a business center with internet-ready computers, a daily continental breakfast, and a

weekly community meal.

What's expected is that residents remain abstinent from all mood-altering substances, have a sponsor, attend four or more 12step meetings a week, do service work, attend weekly community meetings, meet with a coach/counselor regularly, and have a job, go to school or volunteer full-time.

Today Chicago's Hazelden has closer to 70 clients in total and counting, Kasha told the nearly 100 supporters and "alumni" who turned out for an Oct. 5 20th anniversary celebration.

Many in the audience were former patients like Jared, an investment banker who called his time at Hazleden "the most important 15 months of my life."

"I thought I was all grown up when I came to Chicago from back

East, but fell into a major depression and used cocaine and liquor to get out of it," Jared said.

"My marriage had ended, I was about to lose my job. Things were deteriorating with my family," Jared said, adding that while he knew he needed help, "I fought it every step of the way like any good addict would."

"Until I finally realized I had a major problem."

While he's been clean and sober for some time now, Jared said he still goes to meetings almost daily and remains active at Hazelden to give back.

"I keep coming back because there's no place I'd rather be than here helping others. I keep coming back because I need it. This wasn't

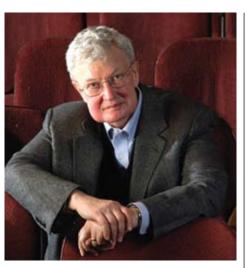












Emerging filmmaker to be awarded **Roger Ebert Award Oct. 20**

Chicago History Museum takes on the Yates papers

Project archivist Adam Melville worked with Chicago History Museum [CHM] archivist Julie Wroblewski as part of his graduate school practicum. In this article, he describes how he processed one of the largest acquisitions in recent CHM history.

This summer, I received the exciting but daunting opportunity to process the papers of U.S. Rep. Sidney R. Yates—a 262-linearfoot collection (the equivalent of more than 500 boxes) in 10 weeks.

Challenge accepted!

So who was Sidney Yates? A representative for the Illinois Ninth Congressional District for nearly 50 years, he is probably best known for his support of the arts and humanities. Other signature issues included advocating for the elderly, U.S. support of Israel, and responsible environmental stewardship. Rep. Yates was born in Chicago on Aug. 27, 1909 and graduated from Lake View High School in 1928; He got his B.A. from the Univ. of Chicago in 1931; his J.D., also from the Univ. of Chicago, in 1933; served in the U.S. Navy, 1944-1946, and was ultimately elected to serve in 16 succeeding Congresses, from Jan. 3, 1965 through Jan. 3, 1999.

Rep. Yates died on Oct. 5, 2000, and his Congressional seat is now held by Rep. Jan Schakowsky. The district covers most of the North Lakefront and North Shore

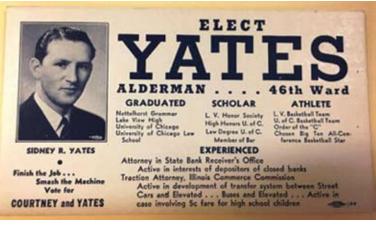
Typically, an archivist begins by surveying a collection as a whole in order to develop a processing plan and formulate series in which the materials will be arranged intellectually. The sheer size of the Sidney Yates papers, however, coupled with the fact that most of it was in off-site storage, meant we would need to alter this work-

After some deliberation, Wroblewski and I decided that we would start processing items and let the series arrangement unfold as we made our way through the collection. Now, this can be a risky approach since success rests on the unprocessed items being organized in the first place (which is not always the case). But seeing as these items had come from a congressional office, we hedged our bets and it paid off: over the decades, Yates had maintained a

vast majority of materials were highly organized.

For three months, we processed the papers in batches, each comprised of approximately 60 boxes. We never knew what the next batch would bring, and the arrival of new boxes from storage was met with anticipation. About 100 boxes into the project, we had a pretty firm idea of what the series arrangement would be, although we made revisions as we uncovered new items.

A somewhat unusual aspect of this project was that researchers were using the collection as it was being processed. This added some pressure to deliver quickly, but it also came with advantages, such as the ability to tap on-site subject experts for content knowledge. In addition, whereas a collection of this size would not normally include detailed descriptions of the contents of each box, since researchers needed immediate access to the materials, we developed a box inventory. Through some experimentation, we found a way to automate converting the working inventory into a more consistent filing method, and the detailed finding aid, a technique

which will help us process large collections in the future.

A great feature of the Sidney R. Yates Papers is the breadth of subjects covered in the collection. Because of his lengthy career, the congressman was instrumental in a large range of subjects, including water diversion; Indiana Dunes National Lakeshore and radiation in U.S. territories; Admiral Hyman Rickover and the development of the nuclear navy; supersonic transportation; the House Un-American Activities Committee; the National Endowment for the Arts; and Jewish topics including Chicago-area Jewish congregations and organizations, Soviet Jewry, Days of Remembrance, and the creation of the US Holocaust Memorial Museum.

Two young offenders approached the couple and one robber pulled out a small handgun, police said. After getting the victims' cell phones, both robbers ran westbound on Leland.

Police said both men are black, 18-20 years old, about 5'-7" tall and thin. One wore a black hoodie, and the other wore a White Sox hat, which was left behind at the scene.

Detectives issued a community alert on Sept. 11 that warned of a similarly-described robbery team that includes a member who wears a White Sox hat.

Chicago police beat #1911, which includes the scene of the hold-up, has recorded 29 robberies this year. That's up from 17 at this point in

Another Boystown Mugging

Meanwhile, Lakeview East racked up its second mugging in as many days Oct. 2. A man told police that four offenders pushed him to the ground in the 700 block of W, Brompton and took his wallet and keys around 1:30 a.m.

The suspects, described only as four young black men wearing red hoodies, were last seen running southbound on Halsted Street, police said.

and Donovan Mylander, 19, each shoplifted some Heineken and headed for the exit around 1:30 p.m. on Sept. 26. Jewel workers were able to reclaim the alcohol in the parking lot, sparking a series of threats from the

Connor told one worker, "I'll knock you out. I'm from the South Side. I don't give a f**k." And Mylander got into a worker's face, yelling "I'm from the South Side! You took my property. I should start swinging on you."

Connor, who lists his home as the Night Ministry, 4711 N. Ravenswood, and Mylander (who lives in the West Loop) is charged with assault and retail theft.

Records show that both Mylander and Connor have been charged with criminal matters that occurred at the Center On Halsted, 3656 N. Halsted, only to walk free when the center failed to show up in court.

Connor was blessed with two free passes from the center in 2015: In one case he was accused of threatening two security quards. In the second case, he allegedly threatened a COH employee: "so you got my peoples locked up" and brandished a "black and silver combat knife," causing the victim to flee the scene and call police.

But, Connor went free because no COH workers ever showed up for his court cases. Now, he's merely barred from entering the COH, making him everyone else's problem while the center enjoys operations without him.

Mylander was arrested at the Center on Halsted during June's Pride Fest celebration. Witnesses told police that Mylander pushed an employee and refused to leave the premises. He was arrested and charged. But, once again, the COH did not send anyone to Mylander's court date, forcing the state to drop charges... once again making him everyone else's problem except their own.

Last November, this newspaper reported that—despite publicly-made promises—the Center failed to show up in court for 25 out of 26 cases in which its employees or agents were listed as victims.

On parole for Red Line gropings, sexual predator grabs teen at Truman College

A registered sexual predator who's on parole for fondling two women at

the North/Clybourn Red Line station in 2014, is back behind

Prosecutors say Barry Marquez, 32, grabbed an 18year-old woman Barry Marquez in a hallway at



Truman College and refused to let her go on Sept. 20. Marquez was arrested last Monday when he returned to the school at 1145 W. Wilson in Uptown, police said.

He is charged with simple battery. A judge set bail at \$3,000 and an Illinois Dept. of Corrections official said the agency would seek to revoke Marquez's parole.

Records show that Marquez was released from prison in July 2016 after serving a fraction of two five-year consecutive sentences that he received for fondling women on the Red Line in

DNAInfo reported at the time that Marquez "grabbed and fondled women on the North/Clybourn Red Line platform... attacking a 28-year-old and a 19-year-old in the course of about 20 minutes" during the evening rush

Marquez currently lists a Rogers Park address as his home.

Rogers Park Alert

Police have issued a community alert after young female victims reported sexual misconduct by an unknown offender in the 1900 block of W. Fargo.

A girl told officers that the man was standing behind the glass front door of a building on the block as she walked past between 7:30 a.m. and 8:30 a.m. on Friday. The man stared directly at the girl, pulled his pants down, and exposed himself, police said.

In a separate case, a man made eye contact with a girl and placed his hand into his pants and began inappropriately touching himself, the alert said.

The offender is a 20- to 30-year-old white man who stands about 6' tall and weighs 170-200 lbs. He has short light brown hair, a light complexion, and he was wearing a white or gray t-shirt with black shorts.

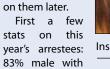

Cubs home game arrests plunge 45% this year; two people account for 10% of the season's arrests

INSIDE PUBLICATIONS

Arrests at Chicago Cubs regular season home games dropped 45% this year compared to 2016, with just 48 arrests being reported compared to 87 last year. Overall, the home game arrest ratio this year was one for every 66,658 fans in attendance.

Incredibly, two people with multiple arrests account for more than 10% of this year's total. More on them later.

Their most common hometown is Chicago (29 arrests) with Englewood being the most common neighborhood of origin. Lakeview and the Near West Side tied for second place.

No arrestees were tazed this year. That's down from two last year.

And the teams that sparked the most arrests were the Pirates (9); Cardinals (7); Brewers (6); and White Sox (5). Last year's top three: Brewers (20), Cards (19), Reds (9).

Most commonly-arrested names: Tyewon (3); Nicholas (3) Jerry, Gregory, and Inshirah (2 each)

Which brings us back to those two folks who managed to get arrested multiple times at different games.

The easiest to explain is Tyewon Haywood, a prolific ticket scalper who was arrested on July 24, August 29, and September 13. Haywood is personally responsible for three of Englewood's four arrests this season.

Not-so-easy to explain are the adventures of Inshirah S. Khatib. Police records show that Khatib was charged with trespassing at Wrigley Field on July 4 and with battery at Old Crow Smokehouse after the Cubs' Sept. 9 game.

Khatib provided police with a St. Charles address in July and an Aurora address in September.

Methodology: Editors determined if arrests are "Cubs related" by reviewing police reports for all police detentions made within a quarter-mile of Wrigley Field and within 3 hours of any Cubs home game. When individuals face multiple charges, we only include the first two counts on each arrest report.

Using private police hotline, alderman's "noisy boater" complaint receives massive CPD response

It's no secret: In Chicago, ordinary citizens routinely endure long waits for routine police service.

But Ald. Tom Tunney [44th] is not a common citizen. He's an alderman.

According to multiple police sources, Ald. Tunney dialed a private number at the 19th District police station around 10:50 p.m. Saturday and demanded that officers shut down "loud music" at Diversey Harbor.

Tunney's 18th-floor lakefront condo overlooks the harbor from a distance.

While most neighbors would consider themselves lucky to receive any kind of police response to a low-priority noise disturbance, the alderman's complaint gained the attention of a lieutenant, a sergeant, two patrol cars and a rapid response unit.

That's right. A rapid response unit which typically trolls higher-crime areas to pounce quickly on incoming violent crime calls—was diverted to handle the sleepy alderman's noise complaint along with the others.

Responding officers "saw no harm... and refused to hassle" the folks who were celebrating the end of summer at the harbor, one source said.

Ald. Tunney's office did not respond to a request for information about the

This is not the first time that the alderman turned to his private helpline because the harbor was too noisy for his personal comfort.

In Sept. 2015, Tunney called the 19th District around 9:30 p.m. to complain about a "rock concert" at the harbor. Responding police were given strict orders: "check their permit or shut it

Officers who arrived on-scene discovered "this is not a rock concert at all. It's some boaters. They turned the music down."

In Town Hall district, police resources have been fully depleted on 121 occasions already this year to the point they could not assign officers to respond to 911 calls.

Stabbed with nail file, man suffers collapsed lung

A Lakeview East man who was repeatedly stabbed with a metal nail file early Sunday suffered a collapsed lung, police said. Now, two men are charged with simple battery in the case as detectives continue to investigate.

Prosecutors say the victim saw Stefan Elzy, 33, lying on the ground in the 2900 block of N. Clark around 12:30

As the victim asked if Elzy was OK, Elzy got up and asked for the victim's phone—possibly believing that it belonged to him.

When the victim refused to hand over the phone, Elzy and Joseph Brown, 27, began arguing with the victim and punching him in the face, police said.

As the fight progressed, Brown pulled out a metal fingernail file and stabbed the victim in chest and back. causing the victim to suffer a collapsed lung, police said. Officers who later searched for the weapon came up empty-handed.

The victim was transported to Advocate Illinois Masonic Medical Center where he was reported to be in serious condition after the attack.

Prosecutors approved misdemeanor battery charges against Elzy and Brown on Tuesday while police continued their investigation. Both men are free on \$1,500 recognizance bonds.

Brown lists the Howard Brown Health Center at 4025 N. Sheridan as his home. No address was available for Elzy, who is identified as "John Doe" in his arrest report.

Burglar busted after he refuses to leave Southport CTA station

There's never a good time to be on a CTA platform after service hours. But being there after burglarizing a nearby resident is a particularly bad decision.

Just ask Julio Liberman.

Police were called to the Southport Brown Line CTA station early on Sept, 27 because the 19-year-old Albany Park resident and two other teens refused to leave the platform, prosecutors sav.

As police issued Liberman's trespassing citation, they learned that he had been seen on video burglarizing a garage and rummaging through a car in the 1300 block of W. Newport, authorities say.

Armed with the new information, cops arrested Liberman. He's now charged with felony residential burglary and felony burglary.

Given probation for 2015 Rogers Park mugging, man is accused of mugging another man in Rogers Park

A Rogers Park man who was sentenced to merely probation for a 2015 robbery is in custody again, charged with robbing another man in Rogers Park last week.

Officers were searching streets near the Jarvis Red Line CTA station early last Wednesday after a 29-year-old man reported that two offenders—including one who was "black, fat, and shirtless"—had just punched him repeatedly in the face and robbed him of his computer bag and schoolwork in the 7200 block of N. Greenview.

It wasn't long before cops found a fat and shirtless Markus Turner, 21, the 7300 block of N. Clark St. Turner was detained and subsequently identified by the victim, police said. He's charged with felony robbery.

In 2016, Turner pleaded guilty to choking, punching, and robbing a man in the 7700 block of N. Paulina on Aug. 18, 2015.

A judge sentenced him to no prison time and just two-years probation for the crime.

Holdson Marcelin, 36, entered the restaurant at 401 N. Wabash and immediately set out to destroy the place, employees told police.

Marcelin's rampage included "smashing glass, flipping tables, throwing chairs, pouring red wine on upholstery" and breaking signage before Trump security detained him, police said.

Police said video of the incident was captured on surveillance cameras and cell phones, but no further details were available.

Last March, a 30-year-old scam artist from Canton, GA, skipped out on a \$1,838.90 bar tab at Trump Tower Terrace. Robert Heath missed a March 17 court date and remains at large.

CTA's "White Powder" suspect in custody

The guy who intentionally sprinkled white powder on an inbound CTA Red Line train during last Thursday's bustling morning rush is in custody, police said.

Kelvin Davis, 41, of West Ridge was caught on CTA surveillance video, pouring powder from a brown paper bag, the department said. Eyewitnesses were able to identify him. He is charged with one count of reckless conduct.

Detectives hoped to have Davis charged with felony counts, but the Cook County State's Attorney refused to pursue the more serious charge, according to a source who requested anonymity.

First responders arrived at the Addison Red Line CTA station around 8:30 a.m. on the morning of the incident and tests found the substance to be "non-harmful."

Nonetheless, Chicago police guarantined the affected car at the Howard train yard where bomb and arson detectives conducted a complete investigation.

At the time, we reported that a source said the suspect had been described as a light-complected black man in his 20's with freckles on his face. He was wearing a beige canvas hat, a red Bulls jersey, and kneelength shorts.

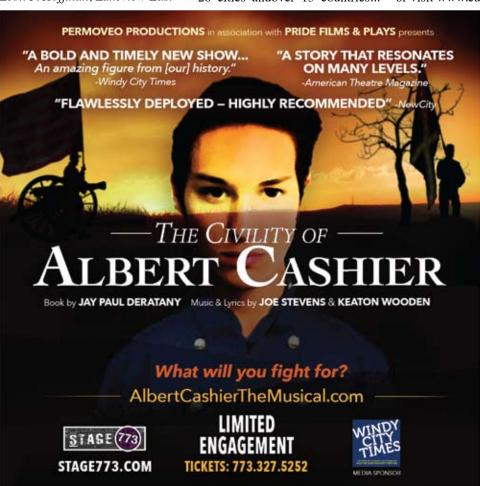
This event will honor iconic musician Ramsey Lewis "who has been loyal to Chicago and active in our community for over 50 years," said Weinberg.

prevent the types of the noise and odors that people were concerned about."

Hopkins says MCA is determining exact dimensions of the screen and then construction will start. In August, MCA told neighbors the enclosure will be in place by the end of the year.

In addition to covering up the equipment, MCA says it will aim kitchen exhaust fans away from Pearson St., relocate telecom antennae, remove a large tent from the terrace, open a back gate during museum hours, add security

Two new security companies have taken over for Monterrey in Minnesota. Both said they are interested in hiring displaced Monterrey employees who successfully complete background checks and licensing requirements.

In addition to the Marathon and Cubs, Monterrey provides guards for the Bears, Blackhawks, and the Chicago Pride Parade.

This newspaper first reported on the Minnesota situation in June after publishing a series of reports that showed another local security company utilized unlicensed guards and police look-alikes while patrolling Lakeview during last year's Cubs post-season.

The Chicago Cubs and Monterrey Security did not respond to requests for comment. The Chicago Police Dept. was not able to provide an immediate response due to time constraints. We will publish the department's statement when it is made available.

This newspaper first reported on the Minnesota situation in June after publishing a series of reports that showed another local security company utilized unlicensed guards and police look-alikes while patrolling Lakeview during last year's Cubs post-season.

And, our reporters first raised questions about the qualifications of the private security firms hired to patrol public events after the June 2016 Pulse Nightclub shooting.

Our interest then was in knowing how the city would confirm that Chicago Pride Parade organizers would provide a promised 160 off-duty police officers for parade security.

Ald. Tom Tunney's 44th Ward office referred us to Chicago Special Events Management, which stated "Our security service is license [sic], bonded and insured, [it is the] same group that does the neighborhood security for the Chicago Cubs. Most are permitted for carrying firearms, a few are certified... but non-carrying firearms. All are certified security personnel."

No one ever answered our questions about how the city would confirm that organizers provided all of the officers they promised to or how the city would ensure the guards' qualifications.
